

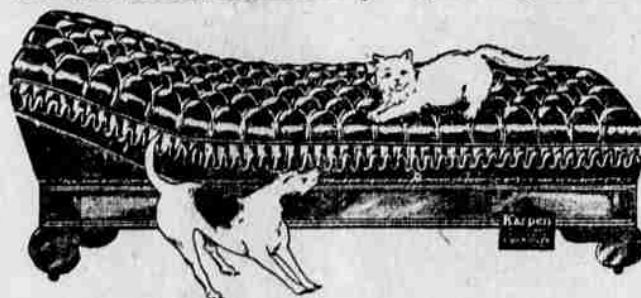

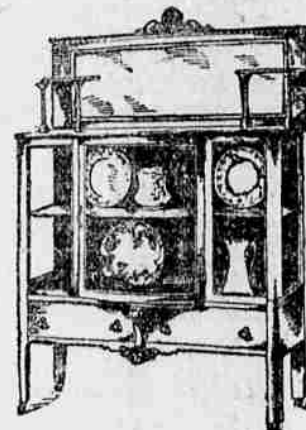

The Siuslaw began carrying the mail again last Monday between Mapleton and Florence, having been repaired and newly painted.

The Oregon & California Lumber Co.'s mill resumed operations last Monday after being shut down for over two weeks.

Mrs. W. R. Hollenbeck and children left Monday for a visit with relatives in the valley.

Mr. and Mrs. Kain of Eugene went to Tillamook lake last Saturday to spend a few days at the Miller ranch.

The schooner Mayflower sailed on Tuesday with a cargo of lumber from the Siuslaw Lumber Co.'s mill for the San Francisco market.

A raft of logs and trash was towed down to the mouth of the river last Monday by the steamer Roscoe and turned loose to drift out to sea.

The steamer Anvil came in Monday from Portland bringing passengers and freight. The vessel proceeded on her way south the same evening.

The schooner Hugh Hogan finished loading at the mill wharf Wednesday evening and left yesterday for San Francisco with a cargo of lumber.

The Siuslaw Lumber Co.'s mill at Acme shut down Tuesday on account of breaking the arbor of one of the saws. It is expected the mill will be idle for a couple of weeks.

The railroad survivors who arrived from San Francisco last week have established a camp at the mouth of Hoffman creek and are surveying down from Mapleton on the south side of the river. Three more men arrived from California the first of the week and joined the party.

D. M. Kemp has resigned his position as bookkeeper for Hurd Lumber & Navigation Co. and will give up the work July 15. He intends to devote his time to the real estate business. Mr. Kemp has been employed by the Hurd company for some five years past. Wm. Cassidy has been selected to succeed him.
