Salem, Or., July 13.—Six leading Willamette valley counties prepared for a permanent compact in a meeting at Albany last night. Linn, Benton, Marion, Polk and Lane gave their pledges to put up the best possible county exhibits at the state fair with a view to consolidating all of these into the exhibit of the biggest land shows in the country this fall. Yamhill county was not represented last night but will join the organization.

A. F. Hofer, president of the Willamette Valley Exhibit association, returned from Albany this morning and will begin active preparations to send out these exhibits. Hofer, Frank Meredith and D. C. Freeman compose ways and means committee for handling the exhibits. The distinctive valley exhibit will be sent to Omaha, October 26; New York, November 3; Chicago, November 18; and to Knoxville and St. Paul later. W. H. Marvin, J. S. Van Winkle and J. C. Holbrook were appointed a committee on permanent organization. A pull together spirit was manifested at the meeting and the entire valley is expected now to come together with less selfish strife and as much zeal as any individual community would have manifested a few years ago.

MILLION DOLLAR TIMBER SALE AT MEDFORD

Medford, Or., July 13.—The Grand Rapids Lumber company of Grand Rapids, Mich., has purchased the holdings of the Trail Lumber company in this county, paying, it is said, about \$1,000,000 for the tract, which consists of 50,000 acres of timber on Trail and Elk creeks. Roy Harrison, representing the company, is now in Medford, and has just closed the deal.

The purchasing company declines to make any announcement at this time regarding development of the tract. A number of small mills owned by the old company will continue in operation, but transportation must be solved before the tracts are opened on an extensive scale.

The tracts changing hands are owned by the Trail Lumber company of this city, L. E. Wakeman and George L. Davis, both officials of the Farmers & Fruitgrowers bank of this city.

Notice of Special City Election July 17, 1911.

Notice is hereby given that by Ordinance No. 1118 duly passed, the Common Council of the City of Eugene has called a Special City election to be held in the City of Eugene, Oregon, on the 17th day of July, 1911, between the hours of 8 o'clock a. m. and 7 o'clock p. m. for the purpose of submitting to the electors of said city two certain proposed Charter Amendments.

1st. Proposing the addition to the City Charter of Section 139, authorizing the Common Council to issue and sell negotiable bonds of the City of Eugene to the amount of \$130,000 for the purpose of refunding the general indebtedness of the city.

2nd. Proposing the addition to the City Charter of Section 140, authorizing the Common Council to issue and sell negotiable bonds of the City of Eugene to the amount of \$37,000 for the purpose of adding to the lighting system, for the betterment of the power plant for laying mains, from pumping station to reservoirs, and for extension and general improvement of water mains and for the purpose of buying additional pumps for the City of Eugene.
