Pittsburg, July 12.—Frank Schlesinger, director of the Allegheny observatory, today reported that a fairly bright comet was seen just before dawn in the eastern sky.

Its right ascension in four hours and 45 minutes and its declination 34 degrees 30 minutes. It is in the constellation of Auriga, not far from the bright star Capella.

POTATOES TAKE

SUDDEN TUMBLE

Price Goes From \$2.60 to \$1.30 Overnight at Stockton

Stockton, Cal., July 12.—Growers of potatoes received a severe shock today when the fancy prices which have been paid the past two weeks for tubers were suddenly reduced from \$2.60 to \$1.30 per sack. Those fortunate enough to have their crop well advanced and dug in time to get the high price have made unusual profits, as potatoes can be raised at good profit at 85 cents a sack in the regular season, but it usually costs more to produce early potatoes.

The dealers and growers who have been studying the big unexpected slump in price have different versions of the cause of the break. Some say the anxiety of both to rush early potatoes on the market cut prices, while other credit the decline to the hot weather through which the tubers have to pass if shipped east.

The unmarketed potatoes already shipped are said to have been damaged and many sacks were rejected. Buyers were forced out of this market and few sales were made today.

ARRESTS MADE FOR REFERENDUM FORGERIES

Henry Coler in Custody at Portland and Warrants Out for Others

Portland, July 12.—Following an investigation by means of the Burns detective agency into forgeries alleged to have been committed in the referendum petitions against the University of Oregon appropriation, Harry Coler is under arrest today, another warrant is out, and Coler is said to have made a statement to the officers that will lead to 10 or 12 arrests and exposure of wholesale frauds involving men in higher station than the lowly circulators.

Coler is one of the circulators of the referendum against house bill 210, passed by the last legislature providing for an additional building and equipment for the state University. This is one of the series of three bills which were blocked by referendum petitions circulated under the same auspices; the others being another appropriation for the University and the third an appropriation for a dormitory at the Monmouth normal school. All three of these are declared by former Justice Slater, attorney for the University, to be reeking with fraud.

PASSENGERS FORETOLD OREGON TRUNK WRECK

Train Was Going at High Rate of Speed When Accident Occurred

The Dalles, July 12.—The coroner's jury investigating the Oregon Trunk wreck resumed work here today and adjourned at noon until tomorrow morning.

Delay was decided upon in hope of locating A. A. Camp and having him present to testify Thursday. Camp, who is construction foreman for Kerrick & Co., was on the wrecked train. He was only slightly injured and left this city yesterday. While here he said to a local banker:

"Just before the accident the train was traveling about 60 miles an hour. I said to another passenger, 'If they keep this up something will happen.' Just then the derailment occurred."

If located, he is expected to present important testimony to the jury. There were no new developments at the inquest today. The only important witness examined was Engineer Myles. He merely reiterated his story of yesterday, avowing he was running but 15 miles an hour.

The condition of Hester and Morris B. Baker, and their father, C. H. Baker of Sheridan, Or., whose wife was killed, is somewhat improved tonight, and all are expected to live.

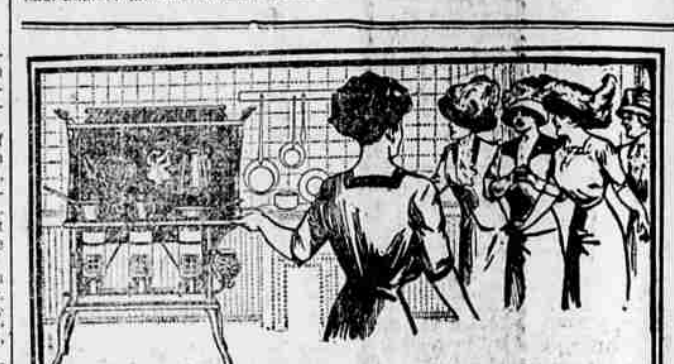
