**NEW LODGE BUILDING AT MARCOLA WILL BE COMPLETED SOON**  
 Expected That Odd Fellows Will Occupy Hall for First Time July 29.

 Marcola, July 21.—The new lodge hall building being erected here by the local Odd Fellows is rapidly approaching completion and it is expected that the regular meeting of Mohawk lodge No. 200, I. O. O. F., Saturday evening, July 29, will be held in the new hall. Appropriate dedication ceremonies and exercises are being arranged, to be participated in by the local lodge and its auxiliary, Mountain Home No. 191, Rebekahs, and invited guests, to take place sometime about the middle of August. The present joint membership here is nearly 150, the rolls showing 87 Odd Fellows and 57 Rebekahs. The new building stands upon the site of the old hotel which was destroyed by fire and as it is centrally located the ground floor will make a fine store room and we understand it has already secured an occupant although it is perhaps 60 days before the finishing work can all be completed.  
 The hall to be used as a lodge room is 40x45 feet and the center 14 feet with large and convenient ante room and property rooms and a large kitchen off the 20x24 dining room. The ground floor is 30x30 feet and has 12-foot ceilings. A modern lighting system is to be installed.  
 The cost of the building is about \$10,000 and the trustees of the local Odd Fellows lodge, J. S. Churchill, H. M. Anderson and F. F. Hubbard are accounting of much credit for the work in hand. The Odd Fellows of Marcola organized in October 1898, and the Rebekahs in June of last year, and they have up to the present time had a leased home in the M. W. A. hall.

**FORMER EUGENE BOY DROWNED NEAR ALBANY**  
 Herman Lorenzen Aged 20 Years, Loses Life in Willamette River.

Albany, Or., July 20.—Herman Lorenzen, a young man residing in Benton county, near this city, was drowned in the Willamette river about half a mile above Albany Wednesday afternoon. He went in bathing and, being unable to swim, expected to stay in the shallow water, which extends 80 feet from the bank. As no one was with him it is not known definitely how the accident occurred, but it is supposed that while wading he stepped over a ledge into deep water.  
 When he did not return home this evening his mother walked down the road to look for him and found his clothes on the river bank. She called neighbors, who secured a boat and found his body.  
 Lorenzen was 20 years old and was a son of Peter Lorenzen and came here from Medford a little more than a year ago.  
 Young Lorenzen resided in Eugene with his parents before going to Medford.

**DEVELOPMENT LEAGUE CONVENTION TO BE HELD AT ASTORIA**  
 Secretary Chapman Busy at Work Arranging Program.

Portland, Or., July 21.—The past will be linked with the future by the convention of the Oregon Development league to be held at Astoria, August 14, 15 and 16, during the time of the Astoria Centennial. The latter is an event of great historic importance, celebrating the coming of the first American colony to the Pacific coast. The Development league convention will also mark a new era in this state for it signals the coming of a new development spirit, probably as significant in its way in its promises for the future as was the founding of the Astor colony 100 years ago.  
 Secretary C. C. Chapman, of the Oregon Development league, is now at work arranging the program for the convention. The attendance of speakers of national fame is promised and this year's convention will undoubtedly be the biggest and best ever held by the league, even though last year's gathering at Salem was one hard to surpass.  
 Such eminent dignitaries of the development gospel as J. J. Hill, Louis W. Hill, Howard Elliott, Gerrett Fort and Carl R. Gray, in the railroad world; President Theodore B. Wilcox, of the league; Wm. Hanley, Wm. Colvig, J. H. Raley, Geo. Winzate, J. S. VanWinkle, vice-president; C. C. Chapman, secretary; George F. Johnson, chairman of the Portland Commercial club promotion committee; Tom Richardson, founder of the league; Governor West; Sam Hill; C. T. Prall and others are on the program. This assures a number of addresses that will be meaty as well as full of interest for the dele-

gates. The press of the state will be represented, editors of the Portland papers being invited to speak, as well as representatives from other parts of the state.

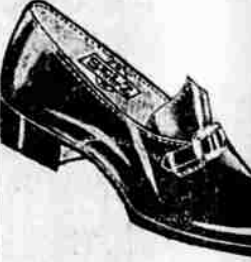
