PROCLAMATION

Whereas, the Common Council of the City of Eugene caused to be submitted to the legal voters of said city at a special election duly held in said city on the 17th day of July, 1911, an amendment to the City Charter of said city known as section 140, authorizing the Common Council to issue and sell negotiable bonds of the City of Eugene to the amount of fifty-seven thousand (\$57,000.00) dollars, for the purpose of adding to the lighting system heretofore provided by said city, for betterment of the Power Plant, for laying mains from the pumping station to the reservoir and for the extension and general improvement of water mains, and for the purpose of buying additional pumps for the city of Eugene.

Whereas, the votes cast at said election have been canvassed by the canvassing board of said city, and whereas it appears from said canvass that there was a total of 888 votes cast at said election on said question, 633 voting for said amendment and 255 voting against said amendment, there being a majority of 275 in favor of said charter amendment.

Now, therefore, I, F. J. Berger, mayor of the city of Eugene, do hereby declare said section 140, the same having been approved by a majority of those voting thereon, to be in full force and effect as an amendment to the Charter of the City of Eugene, Lane County Oregon, from the date of said proclamation.

"UNWRITTEN LAW" CASE EXCITES NEW MEXICO

Wealthy Sheep Owner Kills His Wife's Nineteen-Year-Old Lover.

East Las Vegas, N. M., July 25.—A woman's faithfulness and the inability of a man to take a hint resulted this month in a tragedy and the subsequent holding of Epafrodito Baca, a wealthy sheep man, to answer to the charge of murder. At the trial the defense will probably plead the "unwritten law".

Leopoldo Montoya, the victim of Baca's wrath, was only nineteen years of age. A year ago, Baca alleges, the youth became too familiar with Mrs. Baca. At that time the enraged husband contented himself with giving the infuriated boy a gentle hit in the shape of a bullet in the arm. The wound quickly healed, but not so Montoya's lacerated heart. Impelled by love for the beautiful Mrs. Baca, the lecherous "hint" was lost on the boy, and, Baca alleges, he took advantage of the absence of the husband to resume relations with the woman of his adoration.

Then came the tragedy. Baca returning to his home unexpectedly, knocked vainly on the door, demanding admission. No loving wife responded. Then Baca made entrance by force, and, he says, found Mrs. Baca and Montoya in bed, shivering with fright. In a rage, Baca dragged the youth to the floor and beat his head with a heavy stone, and continued beating, despite the screams and appeals and tears of Mrs. Baca, until Montoya was dead. Assistance was summoned and in the meantime, it is alleged, Mrs. Baca dressed her slain lover in all his clothing, in order that the neighbors might think that he was fully clothed at the time of the assault.

PROMINENT FRUIT

MAN IS DEAD

Portland, Or., July 25.—Millard Oregon Lowndale, one of the leading horticulturists of the Pacific coast, and formerly owner of the famous Lowndale orchard near Lafayette, Or., died yesterday afternoon at 8 o'clock at his home on Clackamas street. Mr. Lowndale had been in poor health for more than a year. Last fall he was obliged to undergo an operation at St. Vincent's Hospital, but his condition did not improve and his health gradually failed. Mr. Lowndale was born in Portland, November 21, 1851, and was the son of Daniel H. Lowndale, one of the earliest pioneers and owner of a large part of the original townsite.

PORTLAND HAS ITS HOTTEST DAY IN 3 YEARS, MERCURY 99.3

Day Was Worst Since July 30, 1907, When Thermometer Reached 102.

Portland, Or., July 25.—When the mercury rose to a point within seven-tenths of a degree of the 100 mark yesterday afternoon at 4:20 o'clock, Portland basked in its hottest temperature since July 30, 1907, when 102 degrees was recorded. The afternoon was a scorcher, the comparative mean temperature showing nothing to equal it since the record day of 1907. The mercury ranged above 97 degrees from 1:45 o'clock until 5:45 p. m. and between 98 and 99 degrees was recorded. Between 4 and 5 o'clock it was 99 degrees and at 2:40 o'clock was 99.3 degrees.

The day started with unusual temperatures, 70 degrees being reached as early as 7 o'clock. At 10 o'clock 80 degrees was registered and at noon 88 degrees, the hottest at that hour for many years. From noon on the mercury rose at a great rate until the maximum was attained at 4:20. With the evening the usual cool breezes were wanting and at 7 p. m. the mercury was still up to 92 degrees.
