AUTOMOBILE NOTES

Tire factories throughout the country are working night and day on delayed orders.

Louis Dishrow has joined the free-lance racing drivers in order that he may participate in more races. He holds the long-distance beach record.

The United States government has found it economical to use automobiles to distribute distilled water and ice in the Philippines. These trucks are handled entirely by the natives, who show great skill in operating the machines.

The Massachusetts Commission on Highway has decided that under the recent ruling of the supreme court of that state, an unsafe speed is an illegal speed and that no motorist is licensed to travel as fast as he likes.

Under the new motor law which has become effective in Iowa, cars are taxed according to horsepower. Eighty-five per cent of the funds derived from this taxation is divided equally among the counties for good roads purposes.

The National Good Roads Board of the American Automobile association of America is trying to impress the road builders, but of maintaining the old ones in such a condition that they will be lasting. The board has been having much attention to the road system of France, which is looked upon as a nation of road builders.

Motoring is decidedly on the increase in Maine, as indicated by figures recently compiled by the secretary of state. These figures show that there are 8,493 automobile licenses in effect in Maine, 1,205 of which have been granted since January 1. The same may be said of the motorcycle registration and dealer's licenses, which have increased rapidly during the first five months of the year.

The public roads branch of the department of agriculture at Washington is still at work experimenting to determine the best form of blider to use for road surfacing, preserving the road and laying the dust. Many of these experiments were carried on last year in co-operation with Cornell university.

Tar, oil and oil-asphalt preparations have been used, and one road has been surfaced with the new oil concrete that has been developed by the department. It is still too soon to give a verdict on the several materials used.

Owners of large country estates are generally adopting light motor trucks for baggage or station work and for general work. Many such places have several pleasure cars in their garages, and the advent of the business car for marketing, hauling baggage from station to house and work of like nature is a logical step, for a defensible light truck is unquestionably more convenient and more economical than the horses that would be required for the same amount of work.

NEWS OF LABOR WORLD

Boston Walters, who have not asked for betterments in seven years, are asking for a slight increase on August 1.

Although applied mechanics is gradually eliminating the house industry, the latest statements show that there are still about 130,000 people in Switzerland engaged in this primitive method of manufacture.

Of the total number engaged in industrial pursuits in Switzerland, 24 per cent belong to the house industry, 75,000 being engaged in the manufacture of textiles and 13,000 in the production of watches.

California has just harvested about the best barley the state ever made, a yield of 50,000,000 bushels. At 75 cents a bushel, the gross income will then be \$37,500,000. This harvest is about one-fifth the total yield of barley for the United States.

A movement is on foot in Illinois to form an independent political party to be controlled by organized labor. All the 800 local unions of the state with more than half a million men comprising the membership have been asked to consider the question. The movement was launched at a recent convention in Rock Island and has the approval of the American Federation of Labor.

It is stated that an increase in wages of a large percentage of the different departments is to be demanded of the manufacturing powers of the United States by the committee representing the National Brotherhood of Operative Pottery during a joint conference which is to be held in Atlanta City next September.

Several Boston firms are affected by strikes of the bottle washers and drivers which has been strengthened by the bottle washers and sorters going out. A demand for better pay has been made, with no results, up to the present. The salary of the bottle washers and sorters has been but from \$7 to \$8 a week, and the strikers declare that it is insufficient for them to live on.

PROCLAMATION

Whereas, the Common Council of the City of Eugene caused to be submitted to the legal voters of said city at a special election duly held in said city on the 17th day of July, 1911, an amendment to the City Charter of said city known as section 140, authorizing the Common Council to issue and sell negotiable bonds of the City of Eugene to the amount of fifty-seven thousand (\$57,000.00) dollars, for the purpose of adding to the lighting system heretofore provided by said city, for betterment of the Power Plant, for laying mains from the pumping station to the reservoirs and for the extension and general improvement of water mains and for the purpose of buying additional pumps for the city of Eugene.

Whereas, the votes cast at said election have been canvassed by the canvassing board of said city, and whereas it appears from said canvass that there was a total of 988 votes cast at said election on said question, 623 voting for said amendment and 365 voting against said amendment, these being a majority of 623 in favor of said amendment.

Now, therefore, I, P. J. Berger, mayor of the city of Eugene, do hereby declare said section 140, the same having been approved by a majority of those voting thereon, to be in full force and effect as an amendment to the Charter of the City of Eugene, Lane County, Oregon, from the date of said proclamation.

Whereas, the Common Council of the City of Eugene caused to be submitted to the legal voters of said city at a special election duly held in said city on the 17th day of July, 1911, an amendment to the City Charter of said city known as section 125, authorizing the Common Council to issue negotiable bonds of the City of Eugene to the amount of one hundred and thirty thousand (\$130,000.00) dollars, for the purpose of funding the general indebtedness of said city, and

Whereas, the votes cast at said election have been canvassed by the canvassing board of said city, and whereas it appears from said canvass that there was a total of 986

votes cast at said election on said question, 746 voting for said amendment and 250 voting against said amendment, there being a majority of 496 in favor of said charter amendment.

Now, therefore, I, F. J. Berger, mayor of the city of Eugene, do hereby declare said section 125, the same having been approved by a majority of those voting thereon, to be in full force and effect as an amendment to the charter of the city of Eugene, Lane County, Oregon, from the date of said proclamation.
