LOOKS LIKE JOHNSON WOULD HAVE EASY TIME WITH CURRAN

Black Champion Meets Irish Heavyweight in London Tonight.

London, Aug. 5.—Jack Johnson wouldn't steal candy from infants, maybe, but his match with Paddy Curran, the Irish heavyweight champion, set for a decision tonight, looks very much like it. Dublin is to be the scene of the historic encounter, and reports from that city state that the Irish sports are falling over each other to get tickets of admission. The Emerald Isle has gone crazy on boxing, and while few expect Curran to whip the "smoke," the fight fans of Dublin consider it worth the price of admission just to see the big black in action.

Curran is a champion at winning on fouls or suffering from them. He it was who was so scared of Bill Lang—just fawney!—that he dropped to his knees in the first round of their go at the Olympia last January when Lang rushed at him, enraging that gent to such an extent that he struck Curran, while he was down and was therefore disqualified. Curran claims the championship of Ireland by virtue of a victory over Jim Roche—but Tommy Burns made a maul of Roche.

It is not known definitely how much Johnson will receive for his battle with Curran, although his press agents set the sum of \$25,000. This is probably an exaggeration, as there is hardly that much loose coin in Ireland. The negro will receive the sum of \$30,000 for fighting Bombardier Wells in London early in September. In November, probably, Johnson will go to Paris and tackle Sam McVey, and will add another snug little roll to his bank account. He is holding out for at least \$25,000 for this mill, and Parisians are so anxious to see him that they will probably cough up.

BATTLING NELSON WINS HANDILY FROM GAFFNEY AT MEDFORD

Medford, Or., Aug. 5.—Doggedly fighting and constantly on the defensive, Tommy Gaffney, a Spokane lightweight succumbed, after being hammered for five rounds by Battling Nelson, at the opera house here last night.

From the start Gaffney did not have a chance. The minute he got into the ring, he realized that Nelson was too much for him and the champion followed him constantly, slugging him in the body and trying to beat down his guarding gloves. In the first Nelson knocked Gaffney off his feet. In the fifth and last round Gaffney came up apparently strong but he was knocked into the ropes and hung there for the count.

In the fifth altercation occurred between Gaffney, his brother and Referee Hanauer, of this city, in which some premeditated slugging was done. Gaffney declared the referee gave him a "rotten deal," in not calling a number of fouls on the part of the Dane.

Gaffney was in a bad condition at the finish, while Nelson was unscathed at the close of fight. Nelson made a three-minute speech in which he declared that the bout with Gaffney was a feather of his condition and that being satisfied, he was ready to try a tougher nut.

"I am going after my old position as king of the lightweights, ladies and gentlemen," he said, "and I am on my way."

There were about 500 spectators.

SWIMMING RACES TODAY AT CHICAGO

Chicago, Aug. 5.—Some of the best swimmers in the country are here to engage today in the Amateur Athletic Union national 880-yard championship. L. B. Goodwin won the race last year, and is also the holder of the mile outdoor swimming championship. His time for the 880-yard swim was 13:12, considerably short of the record time of 11:44 4-5, made by C. M. Daniels, in 1907.

Today's event inaugurates the national championship swimming season of the Amateur Athletic Union. The 440-yard title will be decided at New York at the Athletic Club on August 13, and on the same date the ten-mile swim will be held on the Mississippi under the auspices of the Missouri Athletic Club of St. Louis. The national high diving championship has been awarded to the New York Athletic Club, and will be held September 4. Today's event is in charge of the South Shore Club.

Friday—Yacht races for the King's cup and the Brenton Reef Challenge cup will be held off Newport, R. I.

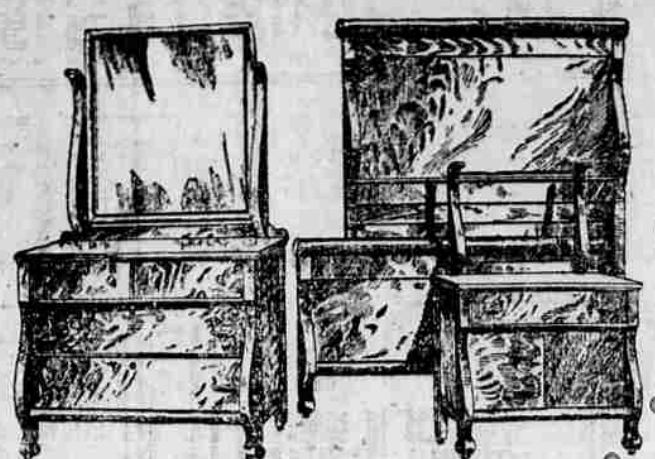
Saturday—All-around championships of the National Amateur Athletic Union will be held at Chicago.
