SIUSLAW BOATS NOW TAKING FULL LOADS

Harbor Improvements Have Deepened Bar Making This Possible.

Of interest as showing that the harbor improvement really benefiting the bar at the mouth of the Siuslaw, is the fact that on the last trip of the schooners Hogan and Sausalito, each carried a full cargo of lumber to the city market. It was the first time this has been possible, as heretofore there has not been sufficient water for these boats when loaded to their capacity, so it has been the custom to put on a little more than half a load here and there, to get enough to complete their cargo, necessitating the expenditure of more time and money.

Road Completed. We are informed that the road between Florence and Waldport now opened so that wagons can travel it all the way with the exception of a few miles between Ira Bray's place and the Yahtoos. Residents of that vicinity have raised funds to open it for the remainder of the way to the Lane county line. This will leave only the road over Cape Perpetua in Lincoln county, which would probably cost several thousand dollars to blast out of the rock. When this road is opened, it would mean a continuous wagon road along the coast from Newport to Coquille. It would seem well if Lincoln county cannot afford to open the road, that the state furnish the funds, as it would benefit a large section of the country.

Killed by a Fall. Henry Landschoot of North Fork, suffered a fall last Friday night at the Bay View hotel, receiving injuries which proved fatal about twenty-four hours later.

He was spending the night in the hotel and about nine o'clock he arose and went outside. In going down the steps from the porch to the sidewalk, in some way he fell and broke the bone of his left hip. He called for help and his cries were heard by a number of persons who hastened to his assistance.

He was carried to a room in the hotel and Dr. Fox was summoned to attend him. Everything was done that could be to relieve his distress, but the shock was too much for one of his years and in feeble health, and he passed away about two o'clock Sunday morning.

Some thought he had fallen out of a door in the second story of the hotel, but Mr. Landschoot stated soon after the accident, that after he left his room, he went down flights of stairs before he fell. This would bring him to the first floor of the building.

PORTLAND MEN TO BUILD RAILWAY TO BAY CITY

Salem, Or., Aug. 7.—Articles of incorporation of the Portland & West Coast Railroad & Navigation Company, Portland, have been filed with the secretary of state. The incorporators are W. E. Pifer, C. F. Lindholm and Jay H. Upton. The eastern terminus of the new road is to be at McManville and the western terminus at or near Bay City, Tillamook county. The route of the line will be from McManville to Sheridan and Willamina, along the course of the Yamhill and Little Netucca rivers. The capital stock is \$1,000,000 and the principal office is to be in Portland.

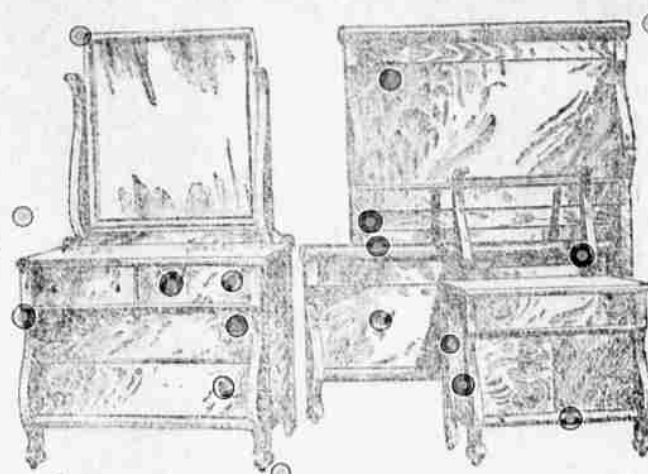
