WENDLING PARTY TO SPEND WEEK ON SIUSLAW

Will Leave His Attorneys Behind to Investigate the Many Timber Titles.

M. G. N. Wendling and his party of railroad men will leave in the morning by automobile on a trip of inspection down the Siuslaw river over the route of the proposed new railroad to Coos Bay. He has decided to confine this trip entirely to the Siuslaw and will visit the Marshfield territory later. The trip going will be made over the Lake Creek route, and they will return by way of the stage route. This will show them two of the several routes selected by their engineers for the construction of the new railroad. The permanent route has not yet been selected. While on this trip Mr. Wendling will formulate his definite plans for the extensive milling operations as outlined in the Guard last evening. He also expects to spend some time fishing and in recreation and will make the trip a semi-vacation tour.

While he is gone his attorneys will be at work on the titles of big timber holdings which he is about to buy. This is an immense task and will probably require the greater part of next week before the big deed can be filed. There are over 100 titles to be examined. Many may have to be thrown out but at present the total consideration is in the neighborhood of \$1,300,000.

PLAYGROUND WORK NEEDS FUNDS BADLY

Work of Training Children May Have to Stop—Two Hundred Children.

The work carried on by the Eugene Playground association is seriously in need of funds and may have to be given up for the balance of the summer if more money is not received soon. At present nearly 200 children are being cared for at the three play grounds. At the Geary and Condon school grounds the children are cared for now in the evenings between the hours of seven and nine o'clock. A new assistant has volunteered his assistance at the Geary school two nights in the week. This is Lee Lonsberry of the woolen mills, who is very much interested in the work with the children. The work of securing the additional money to pay the incidental expenses and the salaries of the three girls in charge will be left entirely to voluntary subscription. One Eugene citizen contributed \$20 to the work yesterday.

Miss Mildred Bagley who was in charge of the playground has given up her work and will return to her home in Salem. Miss Ryder, her assistant will continue the work here. At the Geary Miss Frieda Goldsmith is in charge, and at the Condon is Miss Elizabeth Morrison. The work has proven very popular among the children.

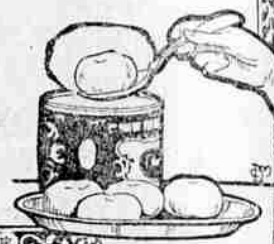
