SPRINGFIELD

SPRINGFIELD PAVING BIDS OPENED AGAIN BUT NOT YET LET

Guard Special Service.
Springfield, Aug. 14.—For the fourth time the city council of this city opened bids Saturday evening for the paving of Main street with hard surface pavement. This time none of the bids were accepted, because an investigation will first be made by the city engineer to learn whether or not the city of Springfield can lay the foundation for the pavement cheaper than the construction company. This city has a complete plant and all machinery needed for laying macadam streets and is paying its residence streets at a fraction of the contractors cost. The matter has been referred to the street committee, and one of these bids may yet be accepted. It is possible, however, that they will have to be advertised for a fifth time. The bid of the Universal Construction company was \$1.85 per square yard. That of the Warren Construction company \$2.05.

SPRINGFIELD WILL VOTE ON SECOND ISSUE OF \$50,000

Springfield, Aug. 14.—On Wednesday of this week the city of Springfield will hold a special election to vote upon a bond issue of \$50,000 for additional street construction and repair. This sum was voted last fall for street construction and since then several miles of Macadam street have been built by the city without the medium of a contractor. So satisfactory has the work been and so cheaply has the macadam been laid, in comparison with the construction cost, that the prevailing opinion stands that the bonds will be carried by an overwhelming majority.

MONSTER TROUT FROM MCKENZIE TO ASTORIA FAIR

C. B. Talbot Takes 50 Trout
for Exhibition—Will Bring
Steelhead Back.

Three cans of McKenzie river fish were shipped Saturday evening by express to Astoria where they will be placed on exhibition. The fish are kept alive in large cans, being fed and given fresh water several times on the trip. Ice keeps the temperature cool enough. The fish were taken from the enclosed ponds at the fish hatchery at Vida. The fish are monsters for size, some of the redsides being over 15 inches in length. Simple Simon would find some real fishing if he could hang his line in one of these cans. Two of the Dolly Varden trout measured 26 inches in length. The fish were brought down at night in order that the heat of the day might be avoided. They were brought by Carl B. Rickman and J. A. Talbot. Mr. Talbot will accompany them to Astoria. There are about 50 fish in all. Mr. Talbot will return Tuesday with a shipment of 70,000 young steel head trout, the second shipment, to be placed in the McKenzie river for breeding in the hopes of establishing this fish in the McKenzie.

FAIR SWIMMER WOULD CROSS GOLDEN GATE

San Francisco, Aug. 13.—Owing to a blunder in giving signals telling of the condition of the tide, Mrs. Terie Desch, a 20-year-old swimmer, failed to swim across Golden Gate this morning. The signalmen on the Marin county shore were counted on to tell when the tide was at flood, but they mixed the signals in some way, and the fair swimmer started 20 minutes too soon.

The result was when more than half way across she met a strong tide that swept her back and made it impossible to reach her destination. Peterson, an ex-lifesaver, accompanied the woman and was forced to give up.
