

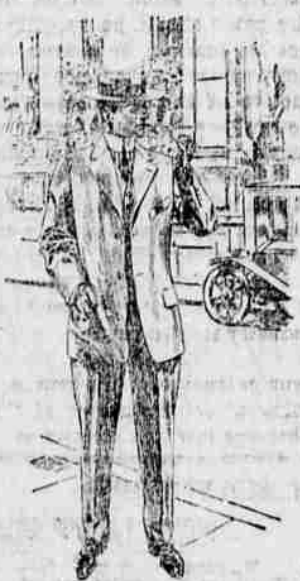

CITY POWER PLANT

HAS AMPLE WATER
SUPPLY ALL SUMMER

Engineer Meyers Visits Plant
and Finds Conditions Very Satisfactory.

Construction Engineer Meyers of the city power plant, was taken to Walterville Tuesday by Mr. M. S. Sverdrup, accompanied by E. S. Frank and John Straub, to make an investigation of the city power plant. The engineer found things very satisfactory in every detail. They looked at the head gates, the race and the power plant itself, and all were highly pleased with the condition in which things were found. The plant is now operating with the McKenzie river at the lowest stage during the year. It was prophesied by many that the plant would be without water during the low water season, but on the contrary there is water to spare. According to the statement of the engineer, the plant could be operated at its full capacity of 2400 horsepower and still have more water than needed.

LUMBER MILLS

WILL ACT TOGETHER

Will Launch Campaign for Advertising Oregon Fir.

Consolidation of three big associations of lumber manufacturers, with an aggregate publicity fund of about \$60,000 a year, and representing over 200 mills, will be effected about August 25, when the millmen of Oregon and Washington will assemble at Raymond, Wash., and put their present organization out of existence.

The bodies effected are the Oregon-Washington association, with headquarters in this city; the Pacific Coast Lumber Manufacturer's association, with headquarters at Seattle, and the Southwest Washington Lumber Manufacturers' association, with headquarters at Centralia, Wash. The consolidated organization will be known as the West Coast Lumber Manufacturers' association, and will have its principal office at Centralia.

Three controlling causes are back of the amalgamation. First is the avoidance of duplication of the work of the three bodies, and greater economy of administration and the combining of three great masses of data relating to the trade.

It is estimated that the mills represented in the company ship 750,000,000 feet of Douglas fir into rail carloads every year. It is expected that the handling of this large output through one central agency will facilitate the dispatch of shipments greatly. One of the purposes of the new organization will be also to exploit new territories in Eastern states and to expand the market for Oregon fir.

Officers of the company are: President, L. C. Wentworth; vice-president, A. C. Dixon; treasurer, O. M. Clark; secretary, E. B. Haxon.

The companies which are represented in the new organization are: Portland Lumber Company, Bridal Veil Lumber Company, Peninsula Lumber Company, Wind River Lumber Company, West Side Lumber & Shingle Company, Booth-Kelly Lumber Company, three mills; North Pacific Lumber Company, Sheridan Lumber Company, C. K. Spaulding Logging Company, Clark & Wilson Lumber Company, Silverton Lumber Company, Curtis Lumber Company, Falls City Lumber Company and Dallas Lumber & Logging Company.

NEW WHEAT IS

LATE THIS YEAR

Local Crop, However, Is of Good Quality and Weighs Up Well—Crop Large.

The Eugene Mill and Elevator company report light receipts of new wheat, compared with corresponding dates in former years. This year's wheat is from ten days to two weeks later than usual, owing to the lateness of the spring season and the unusual hot weather during the forming period. The new crop wheat, the first of which was received August 9, is of good weight and quality, running 62 pounds to the bushel on first sample. There is some shriveled and shrunk grain which will have a tendency to reduce the general average yield; however, the increased acreage sown and the improved methods applied to the general crop production will make a good showing in the season's report.
