RAILROAD NOTES

The Lehigh Valley Railroad holds the record for anthracite tonnage carried last month.

The Southern Pacific is to begin at once the building of a railroad from Eugene, Oregon, across the Coast Range of Mountains to Coos Bay, to be completed in two years. The cost will be about \$8,000,000.

All the shops in Texas of the Texas Pacific have been closed, 1,000 men being thrown out of employment. It is not known how long the suspension will last, and some

of the men are preparing to seek employment elsewhere.

The Chicago & Northwestern is about to further extend its lines into the central Illinois coal fields. Twenty miles of such extension completed last year is now yielding a tonnage of 200 cars daily.

The Big Four is making drastic retrenchments, having added fourteen to the list of seventy-six men dismissed from the Cincinnati office recently. It is expected that the number will be brought up to one hundred before the axe stops swinging. It is understood that in the past few weeks no less than 500 employees of the Michigan Central have walked the plank.

Employees of the Lehigh Valley do

not have to contribute to the pension fund except when it needs replenishing. In response to the last call for this purpose they subscribed \$18,295.71, and the company put in a like amount, bringing the total up to \$40,200.22, and after the disbursements for benefits there remained a balance of \$32,059.42 at the end of the fiscal year.

City of Mexico advises state that a readjustment of the freight rates of the various railroads of the country may be made by the rate commission of the department of communications and public works of the federal government. They have not been changed since 1906, and conditions have changed greatly. It is claimed a radical revision is needed.

FLAT SALARY FOR OREGON STATE PRINTER

Salem, Or., Aug. 19.—So many of the petitions which have been placed in circulation among the labor organizations and granges for the purpose of putting on the ballot a bill to make the flat salary of the State Printer effective in 1912 have already been returned to this city filled out, and other petitions have been asked for.

Those in charge of the work here say that there will be no difficulty in obtaining the requisite number of signers, and that the signatures will be obtained without a cent being paid to professional petition-circulators.

Superintendent Plimpton, of the State Printing Office, said today that no final decision has been reached as to whether the office will be moved August 21, as demanded by Secretary Olcott, or whether the Printer will refuse to move and fight out the case in the courts.
