PREPARING FOR RAILROAD'S COMING

Marshfield Capitalists Ready to Construct Terminal Line.

Articles of incorporation have been prepared for the Terminal Railway, the organization which is to construct the line for which the C. A. Smith company, the Simpson Lumber company, W. S. Chandler, J. W. Bennett and J. H. Flanagan were recently awarded a franchise in Marshfield. The articles of incorporation authorize a stock issue of \$200,000 of which \$100,000 is to be paid up at once. In the selection of the name, the word company or corporation was omitted. The incorporators are the parties named above.

The purposes of the Terminal Railway are specified to build a line of railway down along Indian Inlet, from near the Taylor Signin ranch, through the cities of Marshfield and North Bend and thence to Sunset Bay and such branches or "feeders" as are advantageous from time to time.

P. A. Sandberg, formerly city engineer of Marshfield, has been selected as engineer of the company and this morning began the preliminary survey near the Signin place. The survey will be hastened as rapidly as possible and it is stated that the hope is to get the construction under way soon.—Marshfield Times.
