KLAMATH LAD

DEAD BY ROADSIDE

Klamath Falls, Or., Aug. 21.—With a letter placed in his hat saying he left home because his father beat him while he was sick and starving, Ira Ingraham, aged 15, was found dead within a few rods of the frequently-traveled county road yesterday morning. He was the son of James Ingraham, a restaurant-keeper of this city.

The boy left home ten days ago, after he is said to have been beaten by his father because the lad threatened to shoot him if he did not stop flogging his younger sister and him. He started to walk to Fort Klamath, but became tired and ill and lay down by the roadside and wrote the letter explaining he was starving and would rather die than appeal for aid.

NEW SALEM FACTORY

DESTROYED BY FIRE

Fire apparently of incendiary origin completely destroyed the plant of the Perfection Sewing Cabinet company, located on Fourteenth street, last night between 9 and 11 o'clock. The fire started in the small storage building just east of the main building. At the same time the fire was discovered, an explosion was heard. A short time later an explosion took place in the main building and it was a mass of flames in a moment. Gasoline stored in the main building was responsible for the second explosion and the rapid spread of fire. The building was dry and the fire soon spread to the machine shop on the south, threatening several residences and the Falls City Lumber company's yard on the north and the Warren Construction company's plant on the east.—Statesman.

\$5,000 TO BE PAID

FOR FIR CONES BY

FORESTRY DEPARTMENT

Supervisor Cahoon Returns From Trip Into Siuslaw Reserve—No fires Yet.

Supervisor A. E. Cahoon, of the Siuslaw forest reserve, returned this morning from a two weeks' trip of inspection into the reserve in Lane, Lincoln and Tillamook counties. On his trip he found things very satisfactory. With but one exception there has not been a forest fire in the reserve this summer. This exception is the case of a camp fire that was left but which was discovered by the rangers before it did any great damage.

Mr. Cahoon says that many lying in the reserve are planning to gather cones this year for his department. He proposes to gather 7,000 sacks of fir cones, which amount will be fully one-third the total amount of seed gathered by the government in the Northwest, including Oregon, Washington and Alaska. The gathering of these seed will mean the distribution of some \$5,000 in this territory for picking and for transporting, so that the industry will be quite important.

The price paid for the cones by the government will be between 40 and 75 cents a sack, varying according to the location and quality. At this price men can make from \$2.00 to \$5.00 a day, and while the season lasts it proves very lucrative. Children make as much as \$3.00 a day. The crop of cones is very heavy this year.

COKE RECALL IS

DOOMED TO FAILURE

Roseburg, Or., Aug. 23.—Owing to a lack of funds with which to circulate the necessary petitions, it is understood here today that the movement to recall Circuit Judge John Cole, of Marshfield, has been practically abandoned. It is said that considerable difficulty was encountered in securing signatures in the outlying districts, especially in the four counties which, together with Douglas, comprise the Second Judicial District.

The charge preferred against Cole by the recallers was to the effect that his instructions to the McCallen murder trial were such as to bias the jury in favor of the defendant.

PROMINENT SALEM

ATTORNEY DEAD

Salem, Or., Aug. 21.—W. H. Kaiser, one of the best-known attorneys in the Willamette Valley, died here at 3:30 o'clock following an attack from acute diabetes. Mr. Kaiser was a member of the law firm of Kaiser, Slater & Pogue, which started active proceedings against the University of Oregon referendum. Although he had been in poor health for some time, Mr. Kaiser had been confined to his home, owing to his illness, only a few days.
