IN COTTAGE GROVE

Marshal Snodgrass Closes All Games Where Chips Are Used.

City Marshal F. H. Snodgrass yesterday served the following notice upon all cigar dealers where cards are played for cigars and drinks:

"On and after this date you will not permit anyone to play cards and take all the chips for one game, commonly called pool, complaint has come to me that certain parties are losing all they make playing this game. If this order is not obeyed, card playing will be stopped all together. Each man in the game must get a chip, and it must be understood that unless they want to pay for the game, they are not compelled to do so, and you are to demand the same. Anyone caught playing cards where one is taking all the chips will be arrested for gambling."
