FIVE MEN DEAD

FIVE INJURED

Awful Accident To Douglas County Bridge

Roseburg, Or., Aug. 24.—Five men were almost instantly killed and five others were injured, four seriously, late today, when the big wooden bridge spanning the Umpqua river in Coles valley, 18 miles northwest of Roseburg, collapsed and fell to the water, a distance of about 60 feet.

The Injured.
Ki Thornton, Green Valley, single, back injured, will recover; Ray Wilson, Wilbur, single, back injured; Glenn Wilson, single, leg broken between the knee and ankle; Henry Van Hymning, Umpqua Ferry, married, hip injured; Frank Gilliam, Winchester, married, bruised about the head.

All the killed and injured were members of the Douglas county bridge gang and had been at work repairing the ill-fated structure for about three weeks. With the south end of the bridge intact, the crew this morning began removing the false work to the opposite end of the structure to replace some defective eyebeams.

They had only partly completed the task when the whole span suddenly quivered and an instant later crashed to the water below. The entire crew was removing the floor planking when the collapse came.

Farmers Save Injured.
The noise made by the falling bridge was heard by neighboring farmers, who immediately rushed to the scene of the accident and began the task of rescuing the unfortunate men.

Gary Brown, foreman of the gang under County Bridge Builder Field, Peter McFarland and Charles Gardner were dead when found. It is believed that they were instantly killed. William Accusta was alive when removed from the wreckage, but expired before he could be carried to a nearby farmhouse.

William Bellen, whose skull was crushed, lived for about two hours.

ASYLUM BUILDING

TO COST \$380,000

Salem, Or., Aug. 24.—The board of trustees of the eastern Oregon state hospital for the insane met yesterday afternoon and opened bids for the construction of the building and heating plant of the Pendleton institution. Olson & Johnson of Missoula, Mont., were the successful bidders on the main building, their bid being \$294,675. Theo. M. Barr of Salem, secured the contract for installing the heating plant at \$41,559. The two bids total \$336,234.

In addition to these two contracts there are yet to be awarded sub-contracts for installing bake ovens and a refrigerator plant, plumbing and electric wiring and finish hardware. State Architect W. C. Knighton originally estimated the total cost of the institution at \$381,479. Allowing \$40,000 for the sub-contracts yet to be awarded, the total cost will be approximately \$380,000, allowing \$4000 for unforeseen expenses.
