ROSEBURG THINKS S. P. RAILROAD COMING THERE

Surveyors In Camas Valley
Raise Hopes of Douglas
County Town.

(Roseburg Review.)
Roseburg's long-cherished hopes for railway connection with Coos Bay went soaring skyward as the result of news reaching this city this afternoon of the presence of a party of surveyors at Camas Valley. There is no information as to whom these surveyors represent, but the belief is prevalent at Camas Valley, according to a telephone message received from that place, that they are in the employ either of the Southern Pacific Company or the Coos Bay and Eastern Electric. They are in charge of an engineer named Aston.

Roseburg and Myrtle Point are said to be the objective ends of the survey, work on which began Tuesday. The surveyors, about 16 in number, divided themselves into two parties and began operations on the summit of Camas mountain. One party started westward toward Myrtle Point, while the other began working toward Roseburg.

The movement of one party of surveyors toward Myrtle Point is held to be evidence that the Southern Pacific company is behind these operations. The Southern Pacific owns the railroad operating between Marshfield and Myrtle Point, and no other railroad company could apparently have an object in surveying a route between the latter city and Roseburg. Therefore the plausible theory is that the Southern Pacific contemplates the extension of its Coos county road to Roseburg. It looks like a bona fide project, but the skeptics profess to see a probable bluff to discourage the impending construction of a line from Roseburg to Marshfield. This is strengthened by the announced intention of the Southern Pacific to enter Coos Bay by way of Eugene, it being the belief that the company would not connect with the Bay from two points on the main line so close together.

Engineer Aston, it is learned, has visited Roseburg frequently within the past few months, but absolute secrecy has been maintained in regard to his plans, until now. It is reported that he has secured options on land for rights of way between here and Myrtle Point. Aston, however, is not the only railroad engineer who has visited Roseburg this summer. It is known that other engineers, as well as railroad contractors, have been here looking over the situation and several of these investigators have actually traversed probable routes between this city and Marshfield. It may be that the Southern Pacific has become aware of these activities and, foreseeing troublesome competition, has decided to actually extend its Myrtle Point line to Roseburg or make a strong enough bluff to keep other concerns out of the field.

OREGON POWER CO. REBUILDING LINES AND FUEL BINS

Springfield, Aug. 31.—The crew of Oregon Power company linemen that began the construction of the permanent power line that will replace the temporary line built after the fire, expect to have the work finished next Monday. The transmission line runs due west from the plant until it meets the poles coming from the substation. One set of wires is then sent toward Eugene. This will leave the electrical equipment of the big power plant identical with the way it was before the big fire.

Another force of men is at work on the construction of the fuel bin and the erection of the fuel machinery and conveyors. Over 30 men are employed.

MACHINERY HERE FOR CLEANING PLANT

McIlroy and DeLeon Will Employ Ten or Twelve People When in Operation.

Some 12 or 15 pieces of machinery have arrived for the new cleaning and dyeing plant to be established on East Seventh street in the rear of the Merchants bank building. The firm of McIlroy & DeLeon will have a complete plant in this city for handling cleaning work on a large scale. They will employ a force of from 10 to 12 people and the machinery to be installed has a valuation of over \$2,000.
