RAILWAY PROMOTER DIES IN PORTLAND

Head of Coos Bay and Oregon
Central Victim of Pneumonia.

Portland, Or., Sept. 12.—Francis H. Clarke, president of the Coos Bay & Oregon Central Railway, which he had promoted for the purpose of building a road from Marshfield to Roseburg, died at the Peer hotel on East Burnside street early yesterday morning after a two weeks' illness.

Hard work, necessitated by the demands of the project that he had conceived and was determined to have realized, undoubtedly affected his health. For the last three or four months he had labored almost incessantly, most of that time being under a severe strain owing to the vigorous opposition of business rivals. He maintained his office at Marshfield and for the last four or five years lived in that city.

\$10,000,000 Project Undertaken
When he first went to Coos Bay he obtained financial aid from business men of that community. He organized the Oregon, Idaho & Eastern Railroad Company, which made extensive surveys and for which approximately \$25,000 was subscribed by Marshfield business men. Later he interested eastern and English capital, and the Coos Bay & Oregon Central company was organized, absorbing the local concern. The general route of the line Mr. Clarke proposed to build lay along the Coquille river from Marshfield to Myrtle Point, then following the middle fork of the Coquille to the top of the Coast Range, through Happy Valley to Roseburg. He estimated that \$10,000,000 would be required to complete the project.

Mr. Clarke was a lawyer by profession and had a brilliant mind. He had traveled extensively, was well read, and a close student of affairs. He was an interesting conversationalist and a fluent speaker.

MAINE STAYS DRY BY SMALL VOTE

Portland, Me., Sept. 13.—Revised returns on the question of the repeal of the constitutional prohibition amendment at 1 o'clock this morning reduced the majority against the repeal to 295. The total vote stood for the repeal, 60,218; against the repeal, 60,511. Frederick G. Bassett, secretary of the Maine Non-Partisan local option league tonight said: "We do not concede that the amendment has been reaffirmed. There has been so much contradiction in the returns that we shall wait for the official canvass and at that time shall decide whether to take steps to secure the inspection of the ballots."

CHUM HAPPY WITH CHINESE HUSBAND, SHE WEDS ONE, TOO

Vancouver, Wash., Sept. 13.—Having become convinced by visiting with her former school chum, Mrs. Yee John, wife of a Chinaman, that Chinese husbands are the best, Miss Hazel Wilson, of Portland, decided she would get one as near like her friend's as possible, so she accepted the proposals of marriage of Yee Lin, John's brother.

The four, Hazel Wilson, her husband-to-be, Yee Lin, and Mr. and Mrs. Yee John, came to Vancouver today, secured the marriage license and hurried to G. Lloyd Davis, justice of the peace, who performed the ceremony. He had also married Mr. and Mrs. Yee John, June 5, 1911. This is the ninth mixed marriage to occur in Vancouver within the year.

HARRISBURG GRANTS O. E. FRANCHISE

H. R. Sherrill of Harrisburg, was in Salem yesterday. He is one of that city's councilmen and Monday night assisted in granting a franchise to the Oregon Electric railway company to use one of the streets along which to place its track as a part of the extension to Eugene. The electric line will parallel the Southern Pacific track as close as 500 feet at that point and in crossing the Willamette river there its bridge will be within a stone's throw of the present S. P. viaduct.—Salem Statesman.

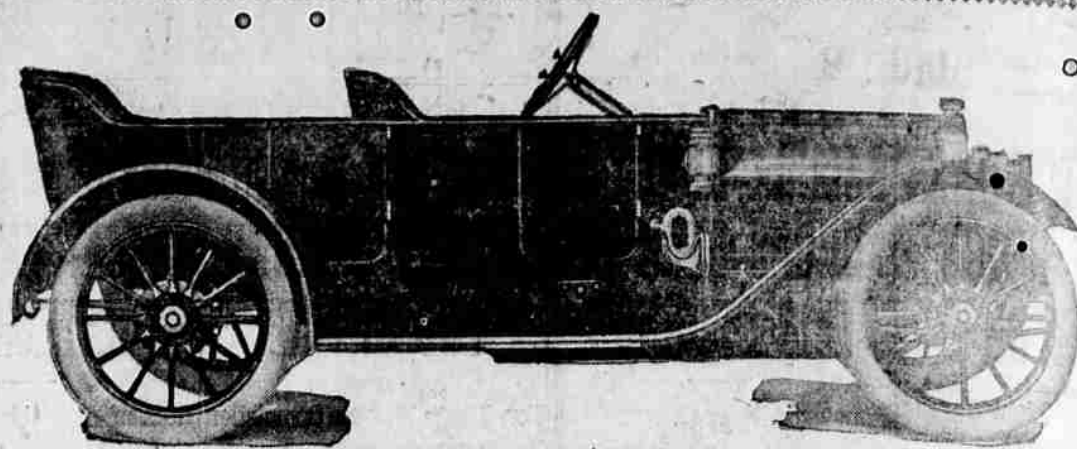
