The funeral of Milton Miles Murphy, father of O. M. Murphy, was held at the Gordon undertaking chapel this afternoon and the remains interred in the Masonic cemetery.

In the matter of the estate of Ernest P. Nelson, deceased, M. Vernon Parsons, J. W. Shumate and J. S. Magladry today filed their inventory of the property of the estate, assessing it at \$3300.

Jas. Hemenway, Sam McKernan, and Ed Jones, recently appointed appraisers of the property left by J. D. Petrie, deceased, today filed their inventory with the probate court, assessing the property at \$927.94.

The Pacific Great Western Rail-

way company today began condemnation proceedings against William Kyle and wife and the Wendling-Johnson Lumber company for right-of-way across a strip of land in section 7 township 13 south of range 8 west. The amount of land sought is 3.5 acres. Conley & DeNeffe are attorneys for the plaintiff.

Judge Harris, of the circuit court, has handed down a decree in the case of J. A. Martenstein vs. Emma F. Ada Oslo, Hattie E. and Pauline Walton, declaring the plaintiff owner in fee simple of a certain 218.03 acres of land in Lane county and that the defendants be paid the sum of \$142, which the plaintiff has deposited in court.

A. M. Willis of Omaha, who came here to look over the country, buying two 10-acre tracts for himself and one for an Omaha friend yesterday, started for a short trip to California this morning. S. R. Cotton, who came with him also bought a 10-acre piece. The land purchased lies near Creswell and was sold through the Eugene & Great Western Land company.

Nicola & Yates, of Florence, have begun suit in the circuit court against William Kyle & Sons company, to recover the possession of a fishing net or the sum of \$115, its alleged value, together with damage in the sum of \$25 a day for each and every day the defendants have had possession of it, since October 7, 1911, and for general damages of \$200. Foster & Hamilton are attorneys for the plaintiff.

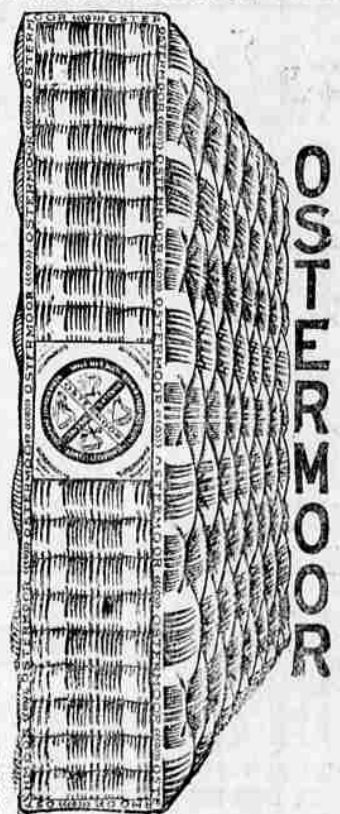
