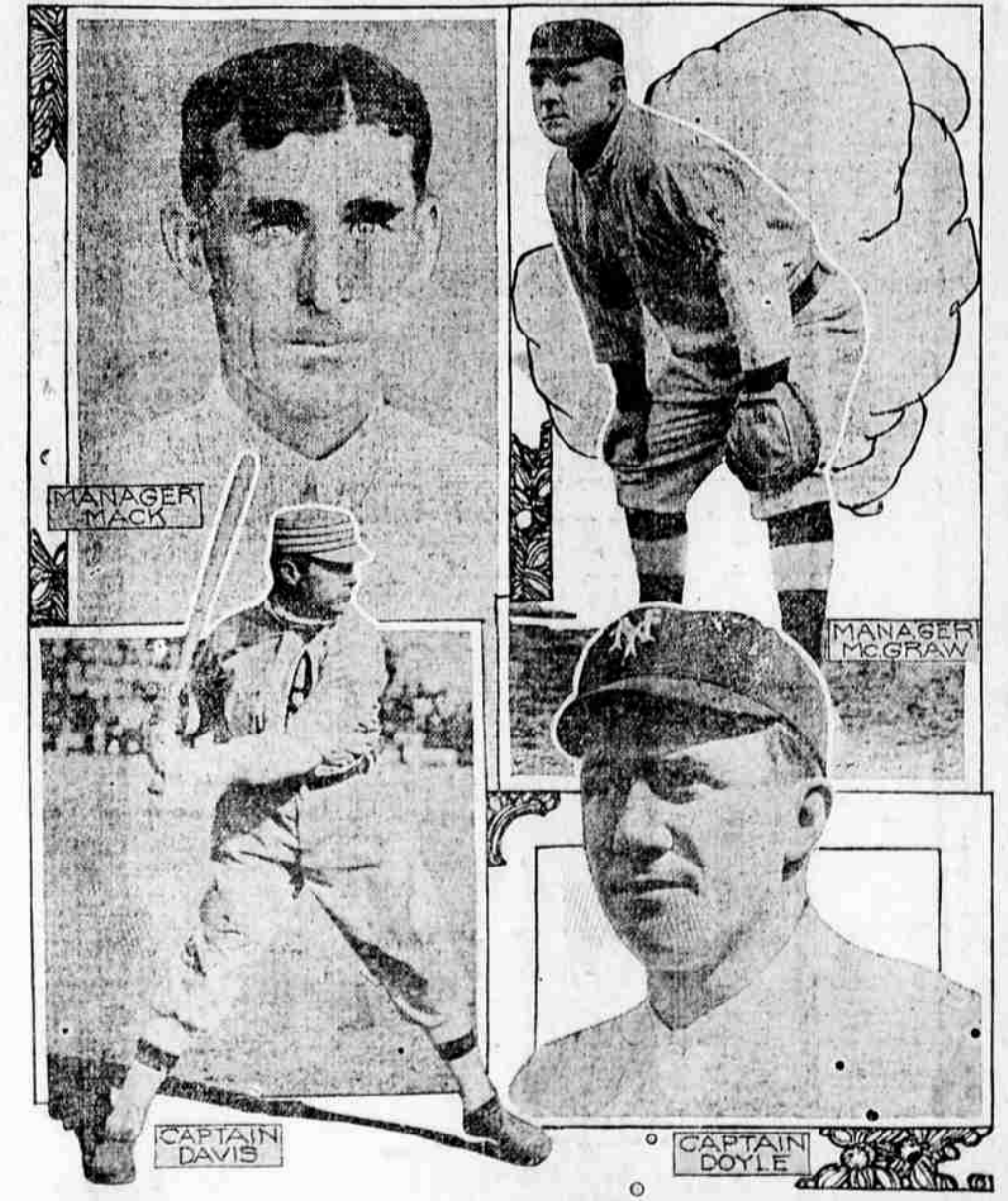
NOTABLE WEDDING IN WASHINGTON
