BISHOP'S ADDRESS TO SUNDAY SCHOOL PUPILS

Effort Made to Raise Money for Children's Ward in Hospital

Good Samaritan Hospital, Portland, Dec. 20, 1911. To the Sunday School Children, Diocese of Oregon:

My dear Children: For many years it has been your happy custom at Christmas to aid the children's ward of our Good Samaritan hospital. It requires \$5,000 to endow a child's cot. Through offering received from you, and others in the past several of these have been endowed, and last year we began to raise funds to endow a new boy's cot. Eight hundred and seventy-five dollars and seventy-nine cents (\$875.75), is the amount now to the credit of this fund.

In advent your offerings go for our church extension work in Oregon, this year to McMinnville. In Lent, they go to general missions. But at your annual Christmas festival in the Sunday schools we ask your money gifts for the endowment fund of the new boy's cot.

You know what bright, active, business-like kids the newboys are. They are out in all kinds of weather, and run greater risks of accident and sickness than most boys. We wish to have a bed in our children's ward where those newboys who get ill or are hurt, may have the best care and nursing free of charge. Last year only a few of our schools took a part in this privilege of giving. Let us try to raise a worthy amount this year. We can if every Sunday-school in the diocese will do something; and if we do a good thing, example I feel sure the our friends, the city newspapers, and perhaps Sunday schools other than ours will also aid the cause.
