SEND ROOSEVELT, IS FRENCHMAN'S PLEA

Former Premier Clemenceau in
Open Letter Makes Appeal to
President Wilson.

(By The Associated Press)
Paris, May 28.—Former Premier Clemenceau, in an open letter, appeals to President Wilson to send over Colonel Roosevelt and "his companions." M. Clemenceau says:

"In advanced France at the present hour there is a name which represents, by I know what force of intuition, the beauty of America's intervention—it is that of Roosevelt. You are too much a philosopher not to know that great popular leaders have influenced men out of all proportion to their own real value, by the intangible atmosphere of legend which has formed around them.

"Whatever may be the reasons and without attempting to analyze the phenomenon, I yield to the imperious need to tell you that the name of Roosevelt has in our country at this time a legendary power. It would be an enormous error in my view to neglect a force which everything urges us to make use of as soon as possible.

"We have learned that the first American unit has arrived at the front and with what zest generals and privates saluted the noble starred banner. However you should know, Mr. President, that more than one stout chevronned polka said to his comrade in an astonished voice: 'But where is Roosevelt? I don't see him.'"

Mexicans to Be Permitted to Work in Border States

Washington, May 28.—Mexican laborers admitted to the United States under relaxed immigration regulations to remedy the labor shortage in border states, will be arrested and deported if they engage in any other kind of work, Secretary Wilson announced today. New rules suspending operation of the literacy test or the contract labor clause for the war emergency apply only to aliens seeking agricultural employment.

U-BOATS ARE HOLDING OWN, GERMAN VIEW

Speech by Lloyd-George Is
Characterized as "Empty
Words" in Statement.

(By The Associated Press)
Amsterdam, May 28, via London.—The speech of Premier Lloyd-George last week in which he said German submarines were being combatted successfully and that England could not be starved by the submarine campaign, is characterized as "only empty words," in a semi-official German reply.

"Facts are lacking," says the reply, "because our navy has found little trace of the new methods whereby, according to the views of the enemy, the submarine danger can be met. Hitherto all enemy experts have agreed that with the present means they are powerless against the serious dangers occasioned by submarines. A change in technical methods cannot be achieved in a fortnight. We calmly await Lloyd-George's prediction as to the future."

duction, there is no need that any one should go hungry. Women must take an intelligent and responsible share in the world's work if we are to see that all the people are fed all the time."

TO PUNISH FOR HOARDING (By The Associated Press)

Washington, May 28.—A bill by Senator Poindestor of Washington to punish malicious storing of foodstuffs and other necessities, under penalties of from six months to three years' imprisonment was favorably reported today by the senate judiciary committee. It would penalize persons who "store, acquire, hold, destroy or make away with" food, fuel or other necessities for the purpose of limiting the public supply or enhancing market prices.

"Speculators and dealers throughout the country are taking advantage of the present economic situation to exert unreasonable profits from consumers," said the report. "These offenses are particularly heinous in times of war. Speculation and profiting by the necessities and hunger of the people in such a time cannot be too severely punished."

ASKS FOR DIVORCE

Carl V. Oglesby, well known timberman and supervising warden of the Western Fire Patrol association, filed a suit for divorce from his wife, Inez Oglesby, in the Lane county circuit court yesterday, alleging desertion. They were married in December, 1915. They have one child, a son eight years of age. The father asks for the custody of the child part of the time.

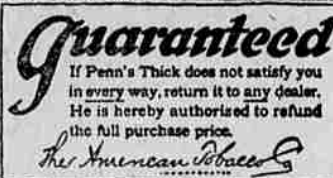
