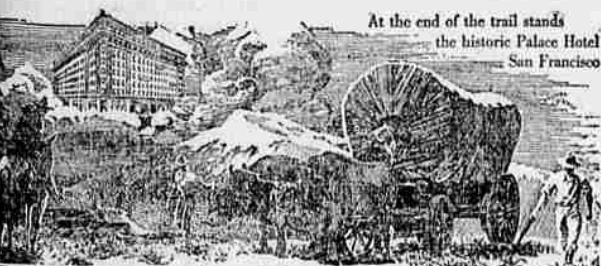

GOETHALS DISMISSES TWO ASSISTANTS IN SHIP BUILDING PLANS
Engineers Who Originated the Wooden Fleet Idea Are Let Out After Statement in Which Chief Is Criticized.
(By The Associated Press)
Washington, June 8.—Major-General Goethals, general manager of the emergency fleet corporation, today dismissed F. A. Eustis of Boston, assistant general manager, and F. H. Clark of New York, the two engineers who originated the wooden fleet idea.
The dismissal of Eustis and Clark today followed their action of last night in issuing statements virtually charging General Goethals with holding up the shipbuilding program in the nation's emergency.
The disagreement between Major-General Goethals, general manager of the emergency fleet corporation and his aides, over the wooden ship building program was considered today at a special meeting of the shipping board with the prospect that F. A. Eustis, assistant general manager of the corporation and F. Huntington Clark, his assistant, originators of the wooden ship plan, would offer their resignations.
Statements issued last night by Eustis and Clark virtually charging General Goethals with blocking the building of wooden ships by demanding an impossible form of contract, opened anew a controversy as to the value of wooden vessels as cargo vessels. General Goethals was expected to announce his position during the day.
Chairman Denman of the shipping board is known to favor wooden ships, but declared today he knew nothing of the Eustis and Clark statements until after they were made and that the board members had not insisted on either steel or wooden ships.

COUNTRY STANDS HIGH IN SCHOOL RECORD
Oregon Stands First in Percentage of Attendance; Lane Is Near Top.
County Superintendent E. J. Moore states that according to statistics given out Oregon leads the union in the per cent of attendance to school enrollment and that Lane county is one of the highest of it not the highest in the state. This puts Lane county well to the top in the entire nation.
County Superintendent E. J. Moore is sending out diplomas to about 50 students in the rural schools of Lane county who were perfect in the recent spelling tests. Lists of words covering the work of the different grades were sent out May 18, and in most of the schools in session at that time the tests were taken. Mr. Moore is also sending out certificates to about 500 students of the rural schools who were perfect in attendance and punctuality throughout the school year.

MRS. W. H. DEMPSTER DIES IN PORTLAND
Wife of Former Principal of Eugene School Passes Away Thursday, June 7.
Mrs. Della J. Dempster, wife of William J. Dempster, died at her late residence, 436 East Twenty-seventh street north, Portland, Thursday, June 7, 1917. The funeral services will be held in Portland, Saturday June 9, at 2:30 o'clock, followed by interment in Rose City cemetery.
Mrs. Dempster was a former resident of Eugene, her husband, Prof. W. H. Dempster having been principal of the Central school in Eugene. They went to Portland to reside about a year ago.

County Superintendent Will Hold Regular Examination June 27, 28, 29 and 30.
That there will be more than the usual number take the regular teachers' examination this month is expected by County Superintendent E. J. Moore. The examination will be held Wednesday, June 27, to Saturday, June 30, inclusive, and the schedule for the various subjects is as follows:
Wednesday forenoon—U. S. history, writing (penmanship), music, drawing.
Wednesday afternoon—Physiology, reading, manual training, composition, domestic science, methods in teaching, course of study for drawing, methods in arithmetic.
Thursday forenoon—Arithmetic, history of education, psychology, methods in geography, mechanical drawing, domestic art, course of study for domestic art.
Thursday afternoon—Grammar, geography, American literature, physics, typewriting, methods in language, thesis for primary certificate.
Friday forenoon—Theory and practice, orthography (spelling), physical geography, English literature, chemistry, physical culture.
Friday afternoon—School law, geology, algebra, civil government.
Saturday forenoon—Geometry, botany.
Saturday afternoon—General history, bookkeeping.

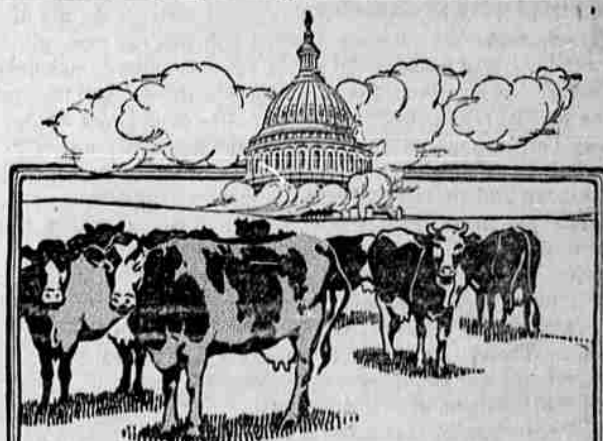
