WHEAT PRICES FIRM IN CHICAGO MARKET

Close 1-2 Cent to 2 Cents Lower With July at \$2.31; September \$2.07 1-2.

Chicago, June 13.—Wheat prices had a downward tendency today influenced by bearish estimates of the spring crop yield. According to one authority, the production in the Dakotas and Minnesota this season will be 160,000,000 bushels against 88,000,000 bushels in 1916. Opening quotations, which ranged from 1 to 3 cents lower with July at \$2.30 and September at \$2.07 were followed by a slight rally and then a fresh downturn.

The market remained depressed during the remainder of the day. Ohio expects the largest yield ever known in that state. The close was steady 1-2c to 2c net lower with July at \$2.31 and September at \$2.07 1-2.

Warm weather made the corn market weak. After opening unchanged to 1/4 lower, prices underwent a moderate further setback and then recovered somewhat.

Heavy buying said to be for seaboard account led substantially to a material advance. Many complaints were received that excessive rains of late had put the crop in an unfavorable condition. The close was strong at gains of 1-8 to 2-7-8c net.

Outs developed relative firmness owing to purchases for houses with eastern connections. It was believed that export business was under way. Provisions eased off with corn. Firmness in the hog market was ignored.
