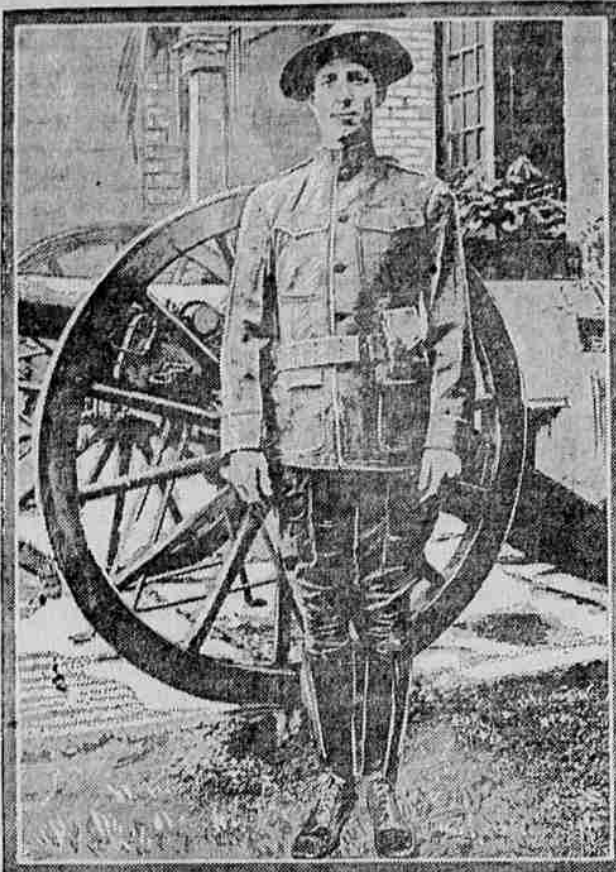

Secretary Redfield Submits Report on Army Registrations

Washington, July 19.—In response to Senator Brandegee's resolution calling for an explanation of the census bureau's population estimates to establish quotas for the forthcoming army draft, Secretary Redfield today submitted a report to the senate showing that the estimates were based upon actual registration figures in each state and sub-division. He pointed out that the large estimates for certain localities, particularly industrial centers, was accounted for by the abnormal gathering of men of draft age at those places for work in munitions plants. The resolution was introduced after several senators had charged that the population of northern cities had been "padded" and the southern estimates correspondingly reduced.

RENA MOONEY SMILES DURING BITTER PLEA

District Attorney Fickert Plays Anarchy in Address to Jury in Murder Case.

(By The Associated Press) San Francisco, July 19.—Mrs. Rena Mooney listened calmly and with a slight smile to a bitter attack by District Attorney Fickert today, when he concluded his address to the jury today that she had heard evidence in the trial of Mrs. Mooney for murder in connection with the preparedness day bomb explosion of last July.

"If this jury does its duty, anarchy cannot live; if it fails law and order cannot live," Fickert declared.

Passages from books on anarchy and from copies of the Blast, which state witnesses testified were found in Mrs. Mooney's apartments were read. "Everything not violence is a betrayal of our

Fickert claimed that the bomb outrage was part of an anarchistic plot, in which Mrs. Mooney played a leading part.

In replying for the defense, Attorney Maxwell McNutt, said that the prosecution "built a rope of sand" which the jury was asked to exchange for a hempen noose. He denounced the explosion as a "dastardly crime," but declared that the state had failed to show Mrs. Mooney's connection with it.

Unemployed Will Be Forced to Work at Idaho Falls

(By The Associated Press) Idaho Falls, Ida., July 19.—Following a mass meeting of citizens, at which L. W. W. agitators, resulting in scarcity of labor, were discussed, city authorities decided that all unemployed men must go to work, leave town, or else be placed under guard in a detention corral and made to break rock. Mayor Geo. W. Edgington this morning issued a proclamation calling on the entire city to respond to the government call for production by helping the farmers harvest their crops.

Separate Trials Denied Men Charged With Riot

(By The Associated Press) Globe, Ariz., July 19.—Approximately 50 men, charged with rioting here today before a justice of the peace. The men were pickets at the Old Dominion mine at the time of the alleged riot. The court denied separate trials to the defendants.
