Eugene Superintendent of Schools Declines to Accept Position at \$2750.

W. R. Rutherford, city school superintendent of Eugene, notified the Portland school board yesterday that he will not accept the position of assistant city superintendent in that city offered him at a salary of \$2750 a year.

Food Expert at Summer School Tells of Proper Feeding for Little Folks.

In the third of her food-economy lectures at the University of Oregon this morning, Miss Winifred Kerr took up the feeding of children, more than 18 months one year old.

Four meals a day are suggested for the child 3 to 4 years old—and the menu is something the same as for the younger child—a bit heavier, of course.

The child from 5 to 7 has reached the potato and boiled rice stage, and his four meals resemble more nearly those of adults.

The lecture Friday afternoon dealt with the topic of meat conservation and meat substitutes.
