MANY ARE PRESENT AT SACRED CONCERT

Fine Program Rendered Sunday
Night; Good Collection Taken
For Soldiers' Mess Fund.

There were estimated to be at least 1400 people present at the sacred concert given at the First Methodist Episcopal church Sunday night.

It had been intended that the headquarters of the staff and the Second and Third companies of the Coast Artillery should be the guests of honor at the concert, but the orders came Saturday after all arrangements had been made, for the immediate moving of the troops. Their absence, thought it may have added sadness to the assemblage, did not deter a large audience from gathering, the entire body and gallery of the main auditorium and a large part of the Sunday school room being full.

The program was an inspiring one and was excellently rendered. The audience burst into cheering when Rev. G. H. Parkinson draped the pulpit with the Stars and Stripes. It was also an inspiring scene when the entire audience joined with Dean Ralph H. Lyman of the University and with the huge choir, in the chorus to "The Battle Hymn of the Republic." Mr. Lyman stated that he chose that hymn because it more fully than any other of the national songs and hymns typified the thoughts and aims of the present time.

Pass Prohibition Resolutions.
The assemblage by a unanimous vote passed the following resolution, brought about by the fact that the Sheppard bill will come to a vote in the United States senate Wednesday:

"Fourteen hundred citizens of Eugene at union meeting Sunday evening, July 29, 1917, request Oregon senators and representatives to vote for national prohibition."

A collection of \$68.44 was taken up which will be added to the mess fund of the Second and Third companies of the Coast Artillery corps.
