Chicago, Sept. 21.—Belief that frosts last night turned out to be almost negligible gave a downward swing today to the corn market. 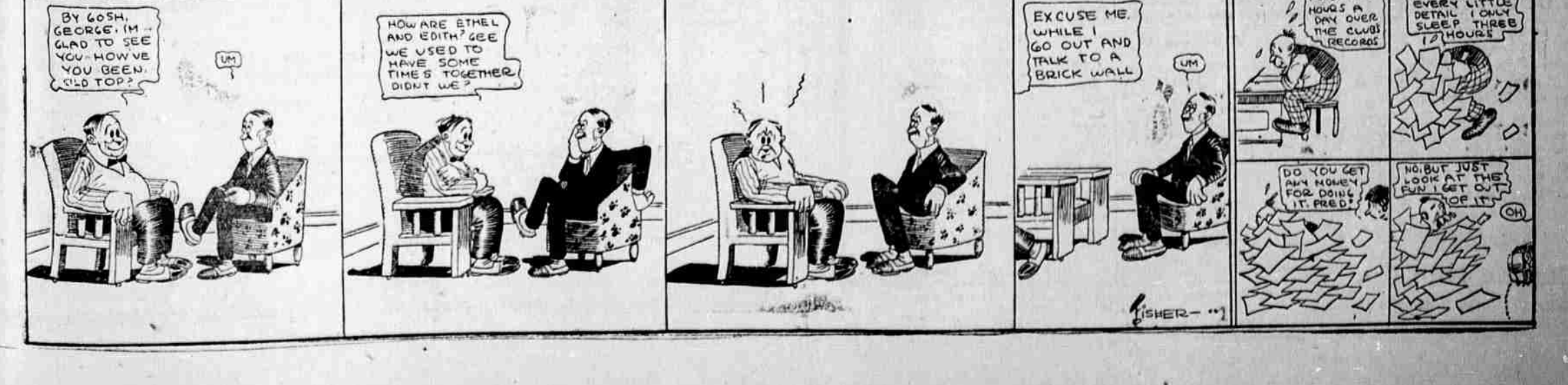
