SPRIT OF AMERICA FUND BEING RAISED

Money to Furnish Recreation for Men in Army Camps Needed.

San Francisco, Oct. 13.—Fun-loving westerners quick to realize that a soldier must play have responded with pleasing promptness to the demand for assistance in the raising of a fund to support "outside of the camp" recreations according to the western headquarters for the war-camp community recreation fund.

With the draft law passed and war and the boys on the way to the training camps, the War Department has come to realize that there must be some play along with all the hard work that is ahead, and has authorized the collection of a special fund for the needed recreations.

At the suggestion of President William the burden of collecting this new source of money which is the only one devoted to the work "outside of the camp" has been placed upon the various Chambers of Commerce throughout the United States. Requests for assistance sent out by John N. Willys, chairman of the National committee, have brought telegraphic responses without number. A part of the country outside the West from the Dakotas to the Pacific Ocean and from the Canadian line to Mexico the commercial bodies have fallen in line and are preparing to gather the various quotas.

Boise, Idaho, wires "Boise Commercial Club assumes responsibility of conducting a vigorous campaign." El Paso, Nevada Commercial Club says "we are with you." From the Chamber of Commerce at Grants Pass, Oregon, comes a telegram saying "Grants Pass is with you strong. Committee organized and awaiting instructions." The Fresno Chamber of Commerce was one of the first in California to accept the responsibility for the work in its district. Raymond, Washington, led that state when it telegraphed that its commercial club was "on the job."

Along with the telegrams and letters from all parts accepting responsibility for the work come many notes of commendation. William B. Dean, director of the Chico, California, Chamber of Commerce, says "We regard your work as very necessary—just as much so as any department in the army." Earl Burt, of Seal Beach, California, and director of admissions and concessions at the Panama-Pacific International Exposition, says "From my experience in amusement work I realize the necessity of entertainment for soldier boys in the cantonment camps. If I can be of service to you in this work you have but to command me."

The amount of money asked for recreation work in the cities about the new American camps is approximately \$4,000,000—\$3.00 per man per year.

Young Canadian Farmer Has 32 Cousins in German Army

Spokane, Wash., Oct. 13.—A young Canadian farmer, who said he had 32 cousins and uncles in the war, told Lieutenant H. E. Mitchell, of the British-Canadian recruiting service, that he would serve in the Canadian army if he were drafted, but thought he should be granted exemption to farm a 185 acre wheat ranch and care for his wife's father and mother.

Lieutenant Mitchell suggested that he should go to war and back up his numerous relations in their efforts. "Why, I can't do that," replied "They are my wife's relatives and are fighting with the Germans."

Nine Sons of Cabinet Officers Serving With Army or Navy

In response to several inquiries the following information is given concerning cabinet members' sons who are serving with the army and navy:

William G. McAdoo, Jr., son of the secretary of the treasury, is under training in the aviation section in the navy reserve, and a second son, Robert McAdoo, has also enlisted in the navy reserve. Josephus Daniels, Jr., son of the secretary of the navy, is a private in the United States marine corps.

Franklin K. Lane, Jr., son of the secretary of the interior, is a first lieutenant in the signal corps, under training to become an aviator.

David Franklin Houston, Jr., son of the secretary of agriculture, is a second sign in the navy.

Humphrey F. Redfield, son of the secretary of commerce, is an ensign in the navy.

William B. Wilson, Jr., son of the secretary of labor, is attending one of the officers' training camps. Another son, Joseph B., is a second lieutenant in the national army, and a third, James H., is a corporal of field artillery.

Exempted Men Raise Fund for Relief National Army

Spokane, Wash., Oct. 13.—The Exempted Men's League of Spokane, composed of men who have been granted exemption from military service, pledged its efforts to raise \$2,000 a month for relief work among the national army men of this city and their dependents.

Exempted men of the city are asked to contribute \$1 a month for the purpose.

GREECE SEES HOPE IN PLANS OF ALLIES

Belief in Athens That Expulsion of Turks Will Aid Greek People.

Athens, Sept. 4.—(Correspondence of The Associated Press)—If the Turk is to leave Europe, as the Entente Allies have required in their war terms, then there is a well-defined belief in the

Balkans that two results will occur of high importance to Greece and all Europe:

First—That the Greek inevitably will succeed the Turk throughout Thrace and in the whole region down to the Dardanelles and the Bosphorus.

Second—That a new zone of territory friendly to the Entente will thus be stretched horizontally straight across the Balkans as a barrier to the German dream of making the Balkans a German highway to the Orient.

Two Results Will Follow

Professor Andrade of the University of Athens, one of the foremost authorities on international affairs relating to the Balkans, holds this view, and in the course of a talk today he explained how these two results would naturally come about in the final peace adjustment, by reason of the principle of nationalities now accepted by the Entente Allies as a basis for territorial readjustment.

Professor Andrade who is a specialist on the extent of Greek citizenship beyond the Greek frontiers—in Macedonia and the other Balkans, in Turkey, Syria and Asia Minor—pointed out the great predominance of the Greeks in the regions to be evacuated by the Turks if they are to leave Europe.

The whole vilayet, or province, of Adrianople, extending from the Balkans down to Constantinople, he declared, is as much Greek as it is Turk and with the Turks out it is practically all

Greek. "Even Constantinople," he said, "is a Greek city—the largest of Greek cities—with a population of 350,000 Greeks. That gives an idea of the extent of Greek citizenship in all this section down to the Straits, which will have to be considered, on the basis of nationality and race, when the Turk leaves Europe."

"That is why I say," added Prof. Andrade, "that if the Turk is to withdraw, the principle of nationality which recognizes the racial condition of a community, will lead to the recognition of Greek paramount influence in that section. Thus far, the principle of nationality has been ignored and violated in all Balkan settlements, and force has prevailed. Austria and Bulgaria have not occupied any of the territory

annexed in recent years by reason that their race or nationality prevailed in these sections, but solely by reason of their military force. That has been the cause of the endless wars in the Balkans, for people are never satisfied when their race is ignored and they are attached to a foreign conqueror by force."

Two Barriers to Germany Seen

Professor Andrade, referring to the Balkan map, showed how the readjustment of Balkan boundaries, based on nationalities, would interpose two barriers to Germanic expansion, toward Asia Minor and the Orient, one, the Greek zone across Thrace, and another the Serb-Rumanian link of territory which lies as a dam between Hungary and Bulgaria. This Serb-Rumanian link

is only fifty miles across, but with Rumania getting the Banat region, to which Professor Andrade says she is entitled by the principle of nationality, this Entente link will be 150 miles across, toward the Orient, and this can be accomplished what it chiefly seeks in the Balkans," said Professor Andrade, "friendly Entente zones intercepting the natural route of Germanic expansion toward the Orient, and this can be accomplished, not by force, but by the principle of nationality now accepted by the Entente powers."
