## CORN PRICES NERVOUS IN CHICAGO MARKET

Close 1-2 to 1 1-2 Cents Net Higher With January at \$1.19 1-2 and May \$1.17 1-2.

(By The Associated Press) Chicago, Nov. 21.—Uncertainty over transportation difficulties and prospects of new restrictions on trading had a depressing effect today on the corn market. Opening quotations, which ranged from 1-4 off to 1-8c advance, with January 1.18 and May 1.16 7-8 to 1.17 1-8, were followed by a material setback all around. Subsequently a sharp upturn in prices resulted from advices showing acute inability to move grain from interior points to terminals. Wall street advances and a more complete understanding of the magnitude of General Haig's success tended also to strengthen the market. The close was unsettled, 1-2 to 1 1-2c net higher, with January 1.19 1-2 to 1.19 5/8 and May 1.17 1-2 to 1.17 5-8. Oats weakened with corn. Business was almost entirely of a local character. Higher prices on hogs lifted provisions. Offerings were scarce.

WATL STREET New York, Nov. 21.—The successful offensive of the Entente allies in France and more satisfactory domestic conditions stimulated today's broad market, leaders making gross gains of 2 to 6 points. Sales approximated 800,000 shares. Gains were irregularly reduced by profit taking in the last hour. The closing was strong. Liberty 4's varied from 97.50 to 98.20 and the 3 1-2's from 99.90 1-2.

Spokane, Wash., Nov. 8.—A combination of circumstances, chief of which is a set of false teeth in his upper jaw, has prevented Paul K. Sorenson, a native of Denmark, from getting into the war on the side of the allies. Sorenson is from North Dakota.

After being rejected for service because of his lack of a full complement of natural teeth, Sorenson bought a ticket here and applied at the local Canadian recruiting office. Because he is an American citizen, however, he was again unsuccessful.

He had registered for service under the selective draft law, and for that reason cannot get into Canada, where he believes he could enlist in the dominion forces. He left for Seattle in the hope that he would find an opportunity there to get into a uniform of one of the allied nations.
