H.," "Story" and "Maine," making up the Vesuvius group; the "Frankie," "San Juan," "Morgan," "Daisy," "Hickey" and "Golden Eagle," making up the Oregon-Colorado group; the "Center Star," "Golden Gate," "Rico," "Montana," "Orange," "Riverside," "McKinley," "Alumina," "Elkborn," "Pasadena" and "Hobart," making up the Riverside group, all in the Bohemia district.

The Baltimore Gold Mining company filed notice of intention to hold the "Baltimore," "Ora Plata," "Rosebud" and "Orphan Boy," all on Fairview mountain in the Bohemia mining district.

Farmers Get \$29,824,000 in Federal Farm Loans

(By The Associated Press) Washington, Dec. 21.—Loans aggregating \$29,824,000 have been made to farmers by the 12 federal farm loan banks during the 12 months since the farm loan system has been in full operation, according to the monthly report of the federal loan board, issued today. In addition \$75,000,000 of loans have been approved and will be negotiated at the old five per cent interest rate when funds are made available through sale of the farm loan bonds privately or to the United States treasury and the pending plan to have congress appropriate \$100,000,000 a year for the purchase. Applications for loans have amounted to \$210,000,000, which has been cut to \$180,000,000 by reductions ordered by appraisers or by rejections. A total of 1830 co-operative farm loan associations, composed of 10 or more farmer borrowers, have been chartered. Future loans will be made at the new interest rate of 5 1/2 per cent. The greatest volume of loans, \$7,300,000, have been made by the Wichita,

Kan., bank, which covers Kansas, Oklahoma, Colorado and New Mexico, and 344 loan associations have been chartered in this district. Second place is held by the Spokane district, comprising Idaho, Montana, Oregon and Washington, with \$5,360,000 loans and 250 associations. Loans in other districts include the following: Omaha, \$1,787,000; Houston, \$1,145,000; Berkeley, \$1,818,000.

42 ARE KILLED IN RAILWAY COLLISION

Crack Express on Louisville and Nashville Roads Telescopes Three Coaches.

Shepherdsville, Ky., Dec. 21.—The death toll taken last night when Louisville and Nashville passenger train No. 7 from Cincinnati to New Orleans, crashed into the rear end of a Louisville, Heardsboro and Springfield accommodation train a few hundred feet south of the railroad station here had reached 46 today.

Blame for the disaster seems to hinge on whether the fast train had been given a clear block or not. Trainmen have given conflicting testi-

mony on this point. Most of the deaths were among passengers on the accommodation train. The steel coaches of the fast train saved the occupants from injury.

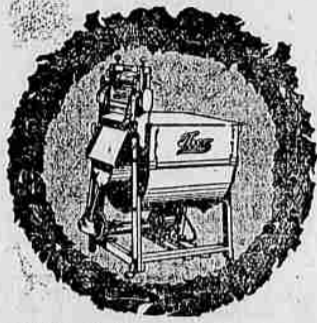

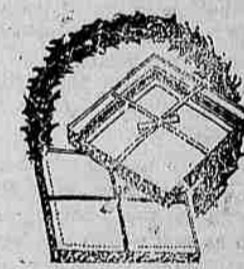

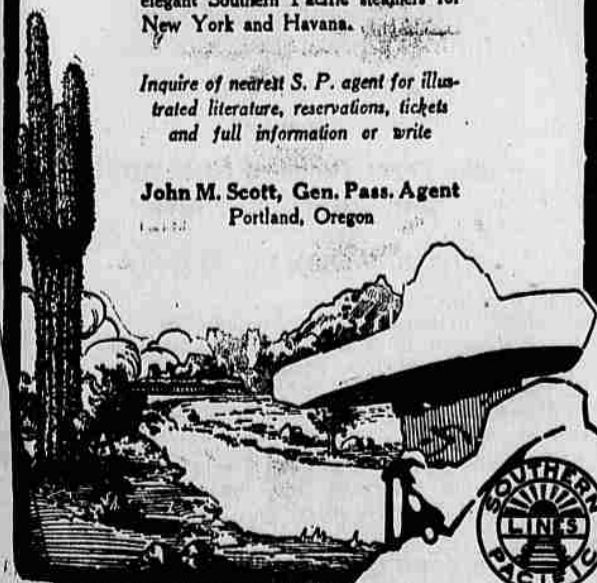
