

OAKUM AND OUTING SHIPMENTS RECEIVED

Red Cross Has Work for Local Helpers and Auxiliaries; Appeals for Piano.

A large quantity of oakum was received at the Red Cross this morning so there will be plenty of work for the men tonight. "And there is always work for the women," one of the officials remarks. The headquarters will be open from seven until ten o'clock.

Two big shipments of outing flannel have also been received, so there will be work for all the auxiliaries. Six hundred yards came in Thursday and the greater part of it has already been cut and sent to the auxiliaries. Another 1600 more was received today. The Red Cross officials request that in those communities where there are cases of mumps and measles, the auxiliaries do not apply for work, until the diseases have run out.

There will be no work at the University Bungalow on surgical dressings for the coming three weeks, because of the week of preparation for examination, and the examination week itself, followed by a week of vacation.

Oath of Allegiance to Be Required in Portland Schools

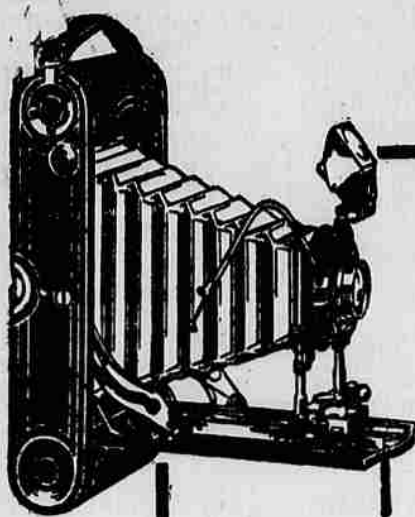
Portland, Or., March 8.—All present teachers and employees of the Portland schools must take an oath of allegiance

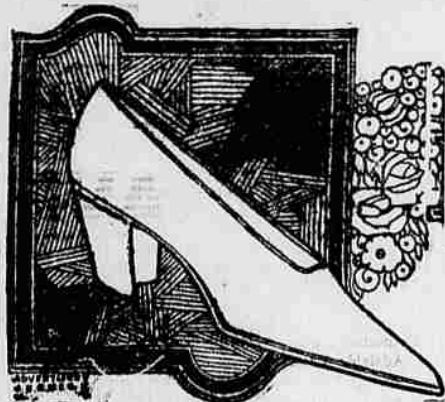
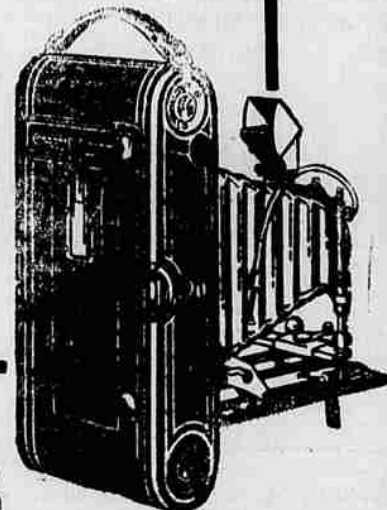

Two well known realty men of Eugene have evidenced their faith in the future of the city by renting the room at 756 Willamette street, formerly occupied by the Scotch Woolen Mills store, and fitting it up as a real estate office. They are F. J. Berger, formerly of the firm of Stewart, Evans and Berger, and J. Darling, for the past year a real estate man of Eugene, and recently connected with the firm of Miller, McLean and Darling. The gentlemen stated Friday that they will do a general real estate, loaning and insurance business, specializing on loans and timber lands, under the name of Berger and Darling. The firm of Stewart, Evans and Berger was crowded out of their former quarters by the enlargement of the store

room in the Matlock building to accommodate the Obak Amusement company, for whom the lower floor of the building is being remodeled. Henry Stewart, the senior member of Stewart, Evans and Berger, has taken desk room with the Lane County Abstract company. John T. Evans, of the same firm, has been sick with pneumonia, and stated Friday that it had so upset his plans that he did not yet know what he would do in the future. Dream Develops Ghastly Reality When It Is Related

Los Angeles, Cal., March 8.—A dream developed into a ghastly reality today, when Mrs. Victoria Sherman, 21, shot and dangerously wounded by her brother-in-law, Joseph Paulus, who then committed suicide.

Mrs. Sherman said she dreamed Paulus crept upon her while she lay sleeping, thrust the muzzle of a revolver into her mouth and fired. She was relating the dream to her sister, Mrs. Paulus, when Paulus rushed in, revolver in hand. Before Mrs. Sherman could escape he had seized her, thrust the revolver between her lips and fired. She managed to perk her head aside and the bullet crashed through her cheek into her neck. As a policeman rushed into the apartment, Paulus retreated to the kitchen and turned the revolver on himself.

Elmer Hupp, Wealthy Oil Operator, Acquitted of Murder

Cleveland, O., March 8.—Elmer Hupp, wealthy oil operator, free from a charge of murder, prepared today to file suit for divorce from Mrs. Ethel Hupp. At the same time Hupp faced a \$100,000 damage suit, brought against him in the interests of the parents of Charles L. Joyce, the man Hupp killed. Hupp was acquitted last night after the jury had deliberated about four hours. Hupp killed Joyce in the attic of the Hupp home January 10. Mrs. Hupp and her daughter were in the house at the time of the killing.

CHEMICAL WORKERS STRIKE

St. Louis, Mo., March 8.—Growing labor unrest in St. Louis gave way to another strike today. Six hundred and fifty men employed by the Mallinckrodt Chemical Company, making chemicals for government munitions, struck this morning for increased wages.
