JUNIOR PROMENADE IS GREAT SUCCESS

Junior Week-End Closes with Big Ball at the Armory; Frosh Burn Green Caps.

Four hundred couples did their bit to contribute to the success of the junior prom, the grand finale of junior week-end, at the Eugene armory Saturday night. The affair was a fitting close to the most successful week-end ever celebrated by the University.

Since Wednesday every incoming train had brought more guests and Saturday there were more than 500 high school students and other visitors being entertained by the University students.

A baseball game between the Oregon freshmen and the Oregon Agricultural rooks Saturday morning opened the day's program and not even the defeat of the home team could put a damper on the splendid spirit that had existed throughout the two days. Immediately after the luncheon hour the center of interest shifted to the millrace, where the juniors captured first honors in the inter-class swimming meet and the freshmen lost the tug-of-war across the stream to the sophomores.

As a preliminary to the University-Oregon Agricultural college baseball game, with its storybook ninth-inning finish, the ceremony of the "burning of the green" was observed. Dripping wet from their plunge in the race, the freshmen ascended on to the field and after listening to short talks by Dean John Straub and James Sheely, president of the student body, cast the green caps they have been wearing all year into the flames.

MISS LUSK IS PLACED ON TRIAL FOR MURDER

Wankeshi, Wis., May 13.—Fully confident, and apparently unaffected by her long residence in the county jail, Miss Grace Lusk was called into court today on a charge of murder—the shooting of Mrs. Mary Newman Roberts, on June 21, 1917.

Emotional insanity is expected to be the plea of Miss Lusk's attorney. The shooting took place when Mrs. Roberts called on the school teacher to discuss the latter's relations with Dr. David Roberts. Since his wife's death Dr. Roberts has sought seclusion.

One hundred and fifty veniremen have been summoned. With the trial opening at 2:30 this afternoon, it is believed two days or more will be consumed in securing a jury.

Many letters are to be introduced at the trial—some of which have not before been revealed. Miss Lusk is expected to make no denial of any acts involving Dr. David Roberts.

One of the letters to be introduced says: "In the 'eternal triangle' the only solution is the 'elimination of one character.'"

In another letter, Miss Lusk is said to have written Mrs. Roberts: "You must have known for a long time that your husband's affections had passed from you, that he cared for some one else supremely. That is sufficient annulment of any marriage vow."

Deceased is survived by a wife, five sons, J. N. Nelson, of Northfield, Minn.; Neen Nelson and Peter L. Nelson, both of Gordonville, Minn.; Emil Nelson, of Albert Lea, Minn.; and A. Nelson, of Cottage Grove, Ore., and one daughter, Mrs. H. Casperson, of Eugene, Ore. Mr. Nelson was a member of the Lutheran church. The remains are at the Gordon and Veatch undertaking parlors and an announcement of funeral arrangements will be made as soon as relatives are heard from.

Belgian and Italian Troops from Russia Arrive in U. S.

A Pacific Port, May 13.—Belgian and Italian troops from Russia were here today ready to go to the French and Italian fronts. They arrived yesterday on an American transport from Vladivostok. There are 230 Belgians and 107 Italians in the party.

The Belgians were part of an expeditionary force which fought for two years and a half in Russia. The Italians were mostly former prisoners captured from the Austrians. Natives of the Trentino, their sympathies were entirely Italian, but they were drafted into the Austrian army and forced to fight against the ally of their country. Captured by the Russians, these Italians volunteered to fight for Italy.

Officials from the French, Italian, Belgian and British consulates extended an official welcome to the troops. They were quartered with an encampment of American soldiers.

MANY FIRES OCCUR IN SOUTHERN LANE

J. H. Chambers Mill Near Cottage Grove Burns for Second Time Within Year.

Cottage Grove, Or., May 13.—For the second time within a year J. H. Chambers, the largest lumber operator in this section, has lost his mill by fire of unknown origin. His former mill, a mile then resumed operations at Wildwood mill, which had been idle.

The dock and most of the lumber was saved by the efforts of the crew. The mill was destroyed by fire discovered at 3 o'clock Sunday morning. A peculiar circumstance is that the watchman had quit his job just the day previous and the plant was unguarded last night.

A report has reached here that the Richardson store and dance hall at Leona was destroyed by fire Saturday night. The big plant of the Leona Mills company was not endangered. It is also reported that a small mill near Anlauf burned Saturday night.

The Ole Christenson home at the Latham plant was destroyed Sunday afternoon by flames resulting from the explosion of a gasoline stove.

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Ordinance to Be Offered to Raise City Salaries

An ordinance will be introduced at a meeting of Eugene city council tonight providing a bonus of 10 per cent of salaries of all city employees at the end of each year. This plan is designed to help the regular municipal workers meet the high cost of living. Police, firemen and street department employees will be affected.

The bonus plan, it is believed, will

enable the city to keep employees despite attractive offers of employment elsewhere.

In addition to the bonus, it is probable that the firemen will receive advances in salaries ranging from 10 to 15 per cent.
