

MANY COMPANIES OF HOME GUARDS TAKE PART IN REVIEW HERE

Major Babb Says Assurances of Attendance Have Been Received from 20 to 27 Companies in County.

The home guard of Lane county is being turned out in force for review by Governor James Withycombe in connection with the celebration of Independence day in Eugene, Major Ray Babb, commander of the Eugene battalion of the home guard, stated today.

"We expect to have every one of the companies in Lane county represented," Major Babb stated. "We have assurances that at least 20 companies will be in line, and believe that the others will also be present."

Major Babb and members of the Eugene home guard will go to Creswell tonight for the purpose of talking over plans for the celebration with members of the Creswell home guard.

A call for the mobilization of all available motor cars for use in the Fourth of July parade was issued today by L. Larsen, chairman of a committee from the home guard.

"There is no limit on the number of cars we want," Mr. Larsen stated today. "We want volunteers among the motor car owners who will take part in the parade. They should notify Mr. Kenney, whose telephone is No. 660, at their earliest possible convenience."

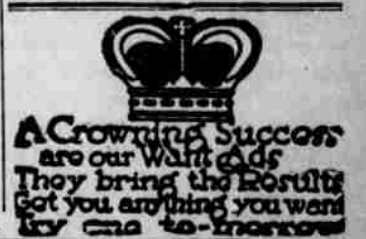
"Oh, say, can you sing from the start to the end,
