GRAIN MARKET PRICES SHOW LITTLE CHANGE

Report of Hot Spell in Southwest Causes Slight Bulge on Opening.

Chicago, June 27.—Reports of high temperatures in the southwest caused some buying at the opening on the Chicago board of trade with a consequent slight bulge. This was offset by later weather and crop reports showing fair conditions. Provisions again were influenced by a rise in hogs.

June corn was nominal. July corn opened 1-8c up, at 1.48 1-2, and dropped to that figure after a brief rise. August corn opened at 1.48 1-2 unchanged and gained 1-4c by noon.

June oats were 1-8c down on opening, at 78, and continued at that price. July oats rose slightly after opening at 72 1-2, but dropped back to that figure later. August oats opened at 68 1-2, up 1-4, subsequently gaining another 1-8c up.

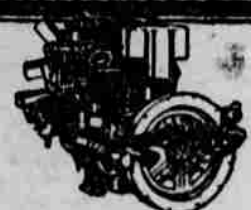
