WANT OREGON MEN FOR SPRUCE SERVICE

War Department Asks for Volunteers from Among Registrants to Report July 29.

Portland, Ore., July 12.—The war department today sent out a call for 175 Oregon registrants to volunteer for service in the spruce division. They are to report for service at Vancouver barracks July 29.

If sufficient volunteers are not obtained by July 23 from class one, special and limited service men and from classes two, three and four, the quota will be filled by draft from special and limited service men.

The quota will be used as follows: Seventy choppers, 50 head buckers, 24 doggers, 25 plain trimmers and 6 general sawmill foremen.
