Construction by State Highway Department.

Sealed bids will be received by the State Highway Commission of the State of Oregon at the Office of the Chairman of the Commission, 1301 Yeon Building, Portland, at 11 o'clock a. m. on the 6th day of August, 1918, for approximately 2000 lin. ft. of 16 foot macadam surface on the Pacific Highway between the Douglas County Line and Conestock in Douglas County. Bids will be considered on waterbound broken stone macadam and waterbound gravel macadam. The work involves approximately 4250 cu. yds. of broken stone or gravel. The contractor will be allowed to use the county road quarry and crusher which is located near the center of the work. No bid will be considered unless accompanied by cash, bidder's bond or certified check for an amount equal to at least five (5 per cent) per cent of the total amount of the bid.

A corporate surety bond will be required for the faithful performance of the contract in a sum equal to one-half of the total amount of the bid.

Specifications, proposal blanks and full information for bidders may be obtained at the office of the State Highway Commission in the State House, at Salem, Oregon.
