TIMBER OWNER TO MAKE TRIP TO LANE COUNTY THIS FALL

Thomas C. Starret Will Come to Oregon With View to Getting Extensive Operations on Siuslaw Under Way.

Thomas C. Starret, of Detroit, Mich., member of the firm of Starret and Hovey, owning one and one-quarter million feet of timber on the Siuslaw water shed will make a trip to Oregon within the next few weeks for the purpose of putting plans for logging operations on a large scale under way, according to word received here. The firm of Starret and Hovey is the financial interest back of the Siuslaw Boom company which yesterday granted a franchise for logging operations on the Siuslaw by the Oregon public service commission. The franchise which virtually gives the company exclusive control over the use of the stream for logging operations provides that the work of improving the stream must begin within 90 days.

Preliminary estimates of the cost of work to be done on the river indicate that an expenditure of several hundred thousand dollars will ultimately be required.

The firm of Starret and Hovey has been interested in the timber on the Siuslaw water shed for many years. It is known that in connection with logging operations on the river the erection of a large mill or mills is contemplated.

The franchise granted by the state virtually makes the Siuslaw Boom company a common carrier, authorized to collect tolls, subject to the approval of the state public service commission, for logging operations on the river. The company will blast out rocky points, remove rocky bars, remove drifts some of which are of great extent and completely choke the river so far as its use for logging is concerned, and make other improvements necessary for the use of the streams for logging.
