# BRITISH WOMEN WIN MILITARY MEDAL BY BRAVERY IN ACTION

Nearly 100 Heroines Wearing Coveted Badge of Distinguished Service for Gallantry and Devotion.

London, Aug. 18. — (By Mail) — The highest honor English war women have won is the Military Medal.

The soldiers' silver medal "for bravery in the field" has now been conferred on nearly a hundred plucky British women.

Among many wonderful examples of courage recorded in the official citations are these:

Sister Charlotte Lillian Annie Robinson.

"For conspicuous devotion to duty and courage when a stationary hospital was struck by four bombs from an enemy aeroplane and one wing was practically cut in two, many patients being buried in the debris. Sister Robinson at very great personal risk went in among the ruins to assist in recovering the patients, quite regardless of danger, her one thought being to escape the patients. She displayed magnificent coolness and resource."

Sister Nellie Galvin.

"For bravery and devotion to duty during an enemy air raid when four enemy bombs were dropped on the building occupied by the hospital, causing much damage to the ward in which Sister Galvin was on night duty. She remained in the ward attending to the sick, several of whom were wounded, and carried on her work as if nothing had happened. She displayed the greatest coolness and devotion to duty."

Staff Nurse Beatrice Dascombe.

"For gallantry and devotion to duty during an enemy air raid when her ward, being destroyed by a bomb and herself wounded, she insisted on remaining at her post and attending to the wounded."

Sister Mary Ellen Davis.

"For gallantry and devotion to duty during an enemy air raid. When the Sisters' quarters were wrecked and bombs were falling, she showed a fine example and assisted materially in controlling the situation and attending to the Sisters who were wounded."

Miss Katherine Margaret Freshfield.

"For gallantry and devotion to duty during an enemy air raid. The ward in which she was working was destroyed by a bomb, but she continued to attend to her patients, and was herself very severely wounded."

Commandant Winifred Eleanor Sarah Mount Batten.

"For gallantry and devotion to duty during an enemy air raid. She superintended the work of the convoy, drove an ambulance car herself during the raid, and by her coolness and disregard of her own safety ensured the prompt removal of the wounded to hospital."

Nurse Mary Gwynne Campbell.

"For gallantry and devotion to duty during an enemy air raid, when buildings were set on fire. She moved about in full glare regardless of imminent danger, taking patients to safety, and inspiring confidence in all."

Following is the citation of the French army conferring the Croix de Guerre on Miss Agnes Mackinnon, British nurse attached to the French Flag Nursing corps.

"A nurse who, under the difficult circumstances of the withdrawal of the ambulance under enemy fire, continued to attend the sick and wounded up to the last minute, with remarkable courage and sang-froid, thus demonstrating the qualities which all her chiefs have recognized in her during the three years that she has devoted herself to the French soldiers."

# RED CROSS HOSPITAL FOR YANKEES READY

Institution Just Completed at Malabry Has Sanatorium in Connection.

Paris, Aug. 14.—(By Mail.)—American Red Cross Military Hospital No. 7 has been completed at Malabry and turned over to the American expeditionary forces, according to an announcement just received from Red Cross headquarters in Paris. The hospital which began operations with about 600 beds is near Plessy-Robinson, about six miles from Paris.

# TRAIN TIME CHANGE EFFECTIVE SUNDAY

Southern Pacific Company Announces New Schedule for Travel; Some Trains Taken Off.

By re-arranging its train schedule, the Southern Pacific Company is able to eliminate two trains and a dining car. One train each way between Eugene and Wendling on the Mohawk branch will be taken off, and the observation and dining cars between Marshfield and Portland, through Eugene, both ways, will be done away with.

The following schedule has been issued by Agent A. J. Gillette:

No. 13, southbound, will leave Eugene at 11:55 p. m. instead of 11:52 p. m.

No. 18, northbound, will leave Eugene at 10:15 a. m. instead of 10:45 a. m.

No. 502 will leave Eugene for Marshfield at 12:20 p. m. instead of 12:10 p. m., arriving from Portland at 12:01, as at present.

No. 501 will arrive in Eugene from Marshfield at 1:30 p. m. instead of 1:35 p. m. and leave for Portland at 1:50, as before.

Both trains will stop in Eugene 20 minutes for lunch.


No. 92 will arrive in Eugene from Marshfield at 9:10 a. m. and No. 91 will leave Eugene for Wendling at 4 p. m. The morning train from Eugene to Wendling and the late afternoon train from Wendling to Eugene are eliminated. The train will tie up over night at Wendling instead of at Eugene.

No. 414, on the Corvallis-Monroe branch, will leave Eugene for west side points at 9:30 a. m. and will arrive in Eugene from the north at 3:45 p. m.
