WOULD END KANSAS STRIKE
Washington, Oct. 12.—President John L. Lewis, of the United Mine Workers, today took drastic action to end the strikes of coal miners in Kansas which have been ordered by Alexander Howat, president of the Kansas coal miners union. By a special order the Kansas miners were removed from the jurisdiction of Howat and placed directly under the national organization.
