ENGLAND OPPOSED TO OPENING 'GRAVE'

Washington, Jan. 6.—The British delegation at the arms conference is unanimously opposed to dragging out of the closet the skeleton of the 21 demands imposed upon China by Japan during the world war.

In this attitude the delegation apparently has the support of other conferees. "We can't go back to re-create history," said the British spokesman. "We have got to deal with the situation as it exists. The 21 demands are not on the agenda of the conference and our task is to get the best possible safeguards for China in its transition from imperial form of government to a republic. If this matter is not on the agenda, it does not interest us."

ARBUCKLE'S TRIAL POSTPONED AGAIN

San Francisco, Jan. 6.—Roscoe (Fatty) Arbuckle's second trial for alleged manslaughter growing out of the death of Virginia Rappe cannot begin Monday as scheduled, superior Judge Harold Lenderback, before whom the case was to be tried, notified attorneys today.

Judge Lenderback said a case now pending in his court cannot be concluded in time for Arbuckle's trial to begin on schedule. "It was believed the postponement would not be for a long period."

Gavin McNab, Arbuckle's chief counsel, emphasized that he would demand only a postponement of a few days, as he was anxious to complete the Arbuckle trial before January 30, when he is scheduled to represent Mary Pickford in her divorce fight before the supreme court of Nevada at Carson City. District Attorney Brady said he also was anxious to avoid delay. Judge Lenderback indicated he would not postpone the case for more than a week.
