

SPECIALISTS SPEAK TO POULTRY RAISERS

Poultry Day program for Friday of Lane County Farmers' week, with addresses by Professor H. E. Cosby, poultry extensionist of O. A. C., and an official of the Pacific Cooperative Poultry Producers' association, was announced today by Ira P. Whitney, county agricultural agent. Changes were also made in the Thursday livestock program, and a women's meeting added.

Professor Cosby, who is well known among the many poultrymen of Lane county with which he has worked, will speak on proper methods in raising poultry and producing eggs. The representative from the marketing organization will tell the raisers what they can expect in future.

The Women's program will be at 2 o'clock Thursday afternoon in the ladies' parlor at the Chamber of Commerce. Miss Lillian Godsey, Lane county health nurse, will speak on "What the Public Health Nurse Can Do For You."

12:00 m.—Noon luncheon with the Eugene Chamber of Commerce—Prof. Paul V. Marins, director of the extension department of O. A. C., will speak.

1:30 p. m.—2:30 p. m.—Place for Eggs on the Diversified Farm, by H. A. Lindgren, extension animal husbandman, O. A. C.

2:30 p. m.—Livestock in Oregon, by Prof. Marins.

UNIVERSITY LIBRARY ADDS 7,469 VOLUMES

The University of Oregon added to its library 7,469 volumes totaling an expenditure of \$4,576.74 during the year 1933, according to the report of Mr. H. Douglas, librarian. This brings the total number of accessioned books in the library to 106,649. This number is exclusive of the Fenton Memorial collection of law books, a large number of other unaccessioned books, and all books that have come into the library since the first of the year.

According to the report 185,404 books were issued by the library in the year 1933. Of this number 154,235 volumes were issued from the reserve department to be used for class assignments, 40,887 were issued by the circulation department for home use, and 3,980 books were checked from the circulation desk in the form of "reserves" that were returned to the desk after being read in the library.

These figures represent a 36 per cent increase over the total number of books issued during the year 1932, a 72 per cent increase over 1931 and 160 per cent more than the total for 1931.

Bloody History Behind String Of Pearls Now Cause of Suit

New York, Jan. 18.—A strange tale of romance, plotting, assassinations and revolutions lies behind the litigation over a string of pearls worth \$1,000,000 in the New York courts today.

Mrs. Horace E. Dodge, widow of the wealthy Detroit manufacturer, is said to be present owner of the gems, which were originally in possession of Empress Catherine II, of Russia. The jewels have a bloody history. Their royal owners were involved in intrigue and treachery from generation to generation. Finally came the revolution, the massacre of the czar's family.

The pearls then were put on the market. Horace E. Dodge purchased them, it is reported, from the Paris house of Benguet Brothers, and the American house of Cartier. Shortly afterward he died.

Benguet is now suing Cartier for a share of the purchase price \$1,500,000 after the sale. The defense is that the jewels did not belong to \$1,500,000.

The pearls are believed to have been worn by Mrs. Dodge when she was in New York recently. Many persons noticed the beautiful necklace, which was one of the most magnificent ever seen here.
