Three Iowans Out for Kenyon's Senate Seat

Washington, Feb. 20.—The contest for the republican senatorial nomination in Iowa has become a three-cornered scrap for the seat which Senator Kenyon will relinquish late this week, when Representative Burton Sweet, third Iowa district, formally announced his candidacy.

Sweet is understood to have entered the race because he believes the two candidates now in the race, former Representatives Pickett and Brookhart, represent the extreme conservatives and extreme progressives respectively.

Sweet's stand probably will be between the two factions.

Sweet is serving his fourth term in the house where he has built up a record for fathering legislation friendly to the farmer and ex-soldiers.

He is one of the leaders of the farm bloc in the house.
