

BILL FOR BOULDER CREEK DAM TO BE INTRODUCED SOON

Washington, April 7.—Realizing that years may elapse before the Colorado river commission appointed by congress concludes its deliberations, Congressman Phil D. Swing, of Imperial, California, announced today that within a week he will introduce a bill authorizing the United States reclamation service to build a dam at Boulder canyon on the Colorado river at an estimated cost of \$20,000,000 and a connecting all-American canal at an estimated cost of \$30,000,000, to irrigate and reclaim three hundred thousand acres in Imperial county and Cochilla on the Colorado desert.

Believes Bill Will Pass

Swing has gone over the subject with Reclamation Chief A. P. Davis and Secretary of Commerce Hoover and says he believes the bill authorizing the work will pass at this session of congress, leaving appropriations to be made at the next session when the work starts.

The proposed Boulder canyon dam will be the highest in the world—820 feet, or 50 feet higher than the Washington monument, and will develop 600,000 primary electric horsepower, several times as much as Muscle Shoals.

"There is no occasion to wait for the commission," said Swing, "for my bill in no way affects adversely the water rights of the up-stream state on the Colorado which is the chief bone of the contention. Nor are rights conferred on said states as the result of agreements which may be made by the commission in the future affected in any way. It may be that this bill will have a tendency to hurry agreement and thus prevent the private power trust of the Pacific coast from getting to an agreement."

Hoover Makes Position Known

Speaking to Congressman Lineberger, California Secretary of Commerce Hoover, federal chairman of the Colorado river commission who returned yesterday from several weeks in the west and on the coast, said:

"If a Pacific coast power company through James P. Girard or any one else is able to persuade the federal power commission to allow it to secure a permanent permit to develop Diamond creek, above Boulder canyon, I think the time has come for me to resign as head of the commission. I am for government development of that project and I always have been."

LLOYD HUNT TELLS OF ORIENTAL TRIP

E. E. Hunt, manager of the Cash and Carry Grocery, is in receipt of a message from his son, Lloyd, who is the radio operator on the Portland built shipping board steamer Bearport, stating that they had a rough voyage across the Pacific. The steamer arrived in Japan early in March, shifted to China and Manchurian ports, thence to India for a full cargo of Java sugar, rice, jute, and other such harvest products, moving from the Philippines. He says:

"In Japan cities, passengers travel about the streets in little two-wheeled carriages called jinrikishas, drawn by men. The islands are very mountainous, but the scenery beautiful. Many volcanoes and hot springs are on the islands. In China, I went to see the great wall which is 12,000 miles long, much of which is standing. Mongolia used to be the home of robbers, and a long time ago one of the emperors of China had this wall built to protect his people from these marauders. I am bringing home one of the old, black, sun-dried adobe straw bricks from this wall, also some of the Manchurian walnuts from Daicun.

"India, not so large as our U. S. A., has about four times as many people. This is the country where they have great jungles, abounding with tiger, leopard, elephant, rhinoceros, monkeys, beautiful birds and the cobra, the most poisonous snake known. It is fun to see the big elephants carry the burdens, kneel for their load of passengers and drag the heavy timbers. I am told the cat, dog, horse, sheep, ox, hog and chicken originally came from this part of Asia, accompanying the people to Europe and thence to America.

"Many of the grains, fruits and vegetables came originally from this region. The magnificent marble palaces, temples and tombs built by the native kings are a sight long to be remembered. The Ganges valley is very fertile, having many irrigating canals, and on the Doon plateau are large tanks to store the water which falls in the wet season. You should see the narrow gauge railroad that leads to hill stations, as the English towns in the mountains are called. The temples on the Ganges are great, massive structures and a design of art and beauty. The Hindus manufacture fine shawls, carpets, rugs, fine gold embroidery thread and beautiful jewelry. They have some fine modern factories, but most of their factory-made goods come from Europe.

"I am hoping to see one of the lesser colonies, India, it is said, has 300,000 lepers. They are trying to cure them with Chaulmoogra oil, which is extracted from a nut growing on the hydrocarpus tree, a variety of which is found on the island of Mindanao. It is educational to travel all over the world as I have done, but I long to be back to good old U. S. A., where people do things right. Java is very hot, but most beautiful. Batavia, capital of the Dutch East Indies, is where you see mosquitos in great clouds; no spring, summer or winter here. Featherweight clothing is in demand here at all times. The governor-general's palace at Batavia is one of the stately and most beautiful buildings I have seen in my travels. The floors are of cararra marble. Fluted Corinthian columns support the roof."—Hood River Glacier.
