WOOL BUYING STEADY
 Boston, Mass., April 21.—Buyers of
 low grade wools for sweaters will ac-
 ceptation steadily in fair volume.
 Also a few big concerns this week have
 acquired a general assortment of wools.
 It is felt that scarcity alone prevents a
 large business.

The wool trade includes nearly
 all grades from the South American
 sources to choice fine merino and domes-
 tic wools. Dealers have resumed opera-
 tion to a limited extent in secured South
 American wools. Occasionally a lot of
 Australian merino is taken out of bond
 and some mill which must have the
 stock.

Nearly 100 bales of Geelong com-
 merino were taken out this week, costing
 the mill about \$1.50 a pound, clean and
 pure wool. This is a pointer as to what
 would have been the wanted business
 were normal in volume and values.

WHEAT STEADY AND SLOW
 Portland, Ore., April 21.—No change
 was made in local wheat bids yesterday
 and the market continued quiet at all
 levels. There is a general feeling on
 the market, but they generally asked
 around \$1.30.

Coarse grains were steady with a moder-
 ate demand.

The Chicago wire to the Gray-Rosen-
 bough Grain company follows:
 "Very narrow, largely local market
 becoming oversold on break, which caused
 closing bulge. General news more fa-
 vorable to buyers. Cash demand some
 better and premiums stiffer. Receipts
 light and likely to continue. Situation
 unchanged."
