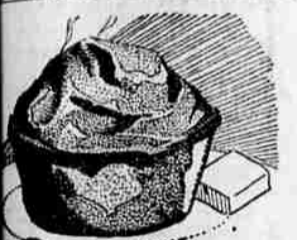


SISTERS CELEBRATE 50TH WEDDING DATE

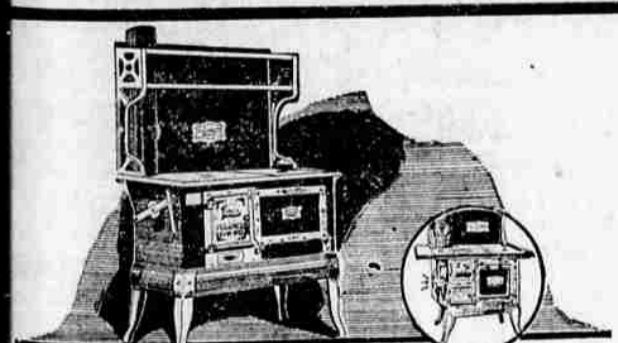

Jackson County Citizens United to Defeat Klan

Medford, Ore., Sept. 21.—In a published communication well-known citizens of Medford and Jackson county, a number of whom have been prominent in politics for years and who now style themselves as independents, attack the Ku Klux Klan and "assure the voters of Jackson and Josephine counties of all parties of our integrity of purpose" in making the communication, in which they say in part: "The self-styled leaders of the republican and democratic parties in Jackson county, through published resolutions, have attempted to rebuke the action of life-long active and honored members of both parties who have condemned the influence of Ku Kluxism in politics. We are loyal to the principles of the great political parties with which we have been affiliated, most of us from our first vote. But we have declined to be Kluxed. As loyal American citizens, we must uphold constitutional government and orderly execution of law. We denounce the effort of the leaders of the Ku Klux Klan to overthrow the former or to interfere with the latter. We decline to vote for any candidate at the fall election in Jackson county or the state of Oregon, who will avow or practice greater allegiance to the 'invisible empire of the Ku Klux Klan' than to the constitution of the state of Oregon or of the United States of America, no matter upon what ticket his name may appear. We shall likewise endeavor to defeat the election to office in Jackson county or the state of Oregon, of any candidate who is affiliated or in sympathy with or apologetic for, such an organization. BASHKIRS CLASSED NATION OF MYSTERY

Ufa, Bashkir Republic, Russia.—(By Mail).—The Bashkirs, recent name of a million and a quarter persons, known as "the nation of mystery" because of the indefiniteness of their origin, are harvesting their crops after a year of deprivation in which the American Relief administration saved their people from starvation. "The origin of the Bashkirs has never been definitely established," said Col. Bell, "and it is a question that does not seem to interest students of races, etc., and several years ago, Prof. Meunier, of Budapest, spent several years living among the Bashkirs and Chevaches, to study their language, customs and characteristics in an endeavor to definitely determine their origin. At all events this little nation is of quite some interest, because of its peculiar people, and especially at present when these people represent a quasi-independent one. It is beyond doubt that the Bashkirs are a freedom loving people. Instinctively the Bashkir is a Nomad, and to present date these instincts have not entirely vanished, and the necessity of being a self-sufficient nation to realize their dream of a republic has not been brought home to them. The masses ignorant in the fullest meaning of the word, there are without any exaggeration, not more than a score of educated men there out of a total population of a million and a quarter. "While the Bashkir is not an actively industrial folk, there has ever manifested much of a tendency toward immigration, it is surprising to note his great interest in matters of the outside world, and especially of matters pertaining to educational affairs. He possesses a remarkable natural intelligence and as past history reveals is very brave and always has shown keen intelligence along military lines. "The Bashkirs are rather a dreamy, poetical inclined people, their music of a quaint minor key is very beautiful. The national musical instrument is the "korumy," a flute made from the dry stalk of the lingwort of ashweed, and the "korumy" flutist blowing into the "korumy," accompanied by ventriloquist sounds, manages to produce some very tender and quaint tones. Unfortunately the "korumy" has never come under the beneficial influence of civilization and still remains the original crude musical instrument. "Breeding cattle, keeping his bee hives, cultivating his soil, drinking 'kumys,' playing the 'korumy' and singing the quaint songs of days of yore, thus may be summed up the occupation of the Bashkir.
