Fruit Market Outlook
Anything But Promising
The Oregon Growers' association, published by
the Oregon Fruit Growers' association, has
issued its report on the fruit market outlook.
A notable change in the market has
come about since our last letter. Buy-
ing is so quiet as to almost equal an
absence of buying. Early shipping prices
every day are being broken. Prices start-
ing off at \$7.00 are now bought for
\$6.00. Peaches are down to bedrock,
while the east and middle west has good
local crops of all kinds of fruits and
vegetables. The demand for pineapples
and sugar for local canning purposes is
terrible. Dried local canning are offered
cheaper today than what the association
has sold her Mission brand for.
The market outlook is not so bright as
it was a month ago. The shipping
season is now on and a half to seven
cents a pound on all unsold 1923 pack
and is selling new pack slightly above
these prices. The California market is still
reeling from its opening prices. New
York state has an immense apple crop
and will dry apples heavily. Green
apples of the Walla Walla and Idaho
varieties are reported to be selling only on
speculation, which may increase tonnage
shipment, which may increase tonnage
shipment. Strike conditions where it
affects the movement of fresh fruit
from California may lead to more dried fruit
than would have otherwise been the case.
On top of that we see no immediate im-
provement in Central Europe and, lo-
cally, strikes and reported shutdown of
