**WAR IS DECLARED ON
 ALSEA DEER SLAYERS**

Disregard for game laws and a reign of terror against game law enforcement officers will be stopped in the Alsea district, even though every resource of the state game commission has to be used, according to an announcement made Wednesday by E. M. Brown, chief deputy game warden, following the filing of reports on arrests for law violations and assault of officers made this week.

The deputy game officers involved in the most recent "reign of terror" at Alsea are Charles A. Russell, F. A. McDaniel and Hawker Grover G. Bailey of Alsea was named as the storm center in the recent fight and Byron Tom and Elmer Pankay, also of Alsea, are under arrest for assault.

Makes Sausage.
 Warden Russell went to Benton county early this week to check up on reports of deer slaughtering near there. He was instructed to see Bailey for information on violators. At Bailey's cabin Russell, however, found his intended informant busy making sausage out of deer meat. Bailey was arrested and taken to Alsea.

Trouble makers of the mountain town gathered when Russell brought Bailey to the town and through numbers the game warden was forced out of town. Stage operators and others were in sympathy with the trouble makers and Russell was forced to start hiking toward Waldport, which is many miles distant.

Ring Leader Arrested.
 Meanwhile the game department ordered Warden McDaniel and Hawker Grover G. Bailey several miles out of the town. The three wardens returned to Alsea and arrested several "rough-and-tumble" fighters arrested Tom Pankay, ring leader of the terrorists. Bailey was fined \$50 for possession of deer meat and Tom and Pankay were held under \$100 bail, each following hearings at Philomath.

The game department reported today that a number of warrants would be obtained for the arrest of other residents of the Alsea district. Meanwhile wardens have been instructed to make a thorough clean-up of the district.

**Jilted Cook Slays Girl
 He Loves; Shoots Self**

Tacoma, Dec. 21.—Inability to gain the love of a woman resulted in Theodore Gaddberry, 23, a cook, wounding two fellow employes and then killing himself here last night in the restaurant where he was employed.

The wounded are Miss Aabel Kandal, 21, waitress, and Harold Hetrick, a clerk. Gaddberry was reported to have been desperately in love with Miss Kandal, and threatened to kill her if she refused to marry him.

On her way home last evening as she passed through the room where Gaddberry was at work, he pulled an automatic pistol and fired. N. R. Bohling, the proprietor, grappled with the man and attempted to gain possession of the pistol. One shot struck the girl in the right shoulder and another went wild, pierced the door, struck Hetrick, who was at work at the front of the restaurant in the leg.

Gaddberry then fired a shot into his temple, and died two hours later in the county hospital.
