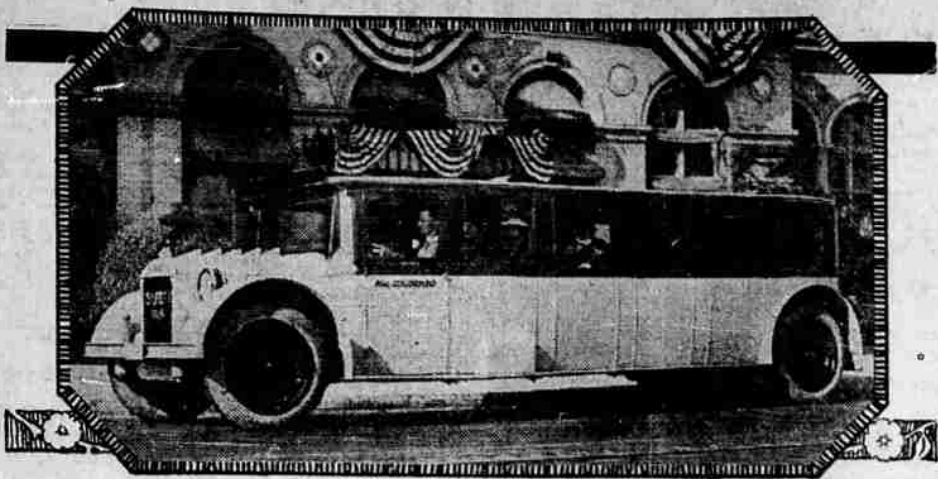


Huge Blue Fageol, one of Fleet Operated on Eugene-Roseburg Auto Stage Run.

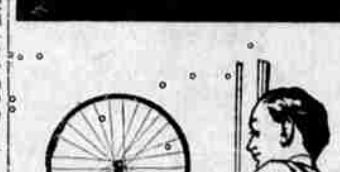
