Five O. A. C. Students are in Lane Jail

Five Oregon Agricultural College
students, three of them said to be
seniors, were in the Lane county
jail today and will likely face
charges of theft.

It is alleged that the youths, who
were here for Junior week-end,
stole five lap robes from two different garages,
a leather back rest, a street sign
and a bottle on the streets. They
were arrested Sunday morning
about 3 o'clock by Will Jenkins,
police captain. They spent
some time in the city jail before
being removed to the county
jail.
